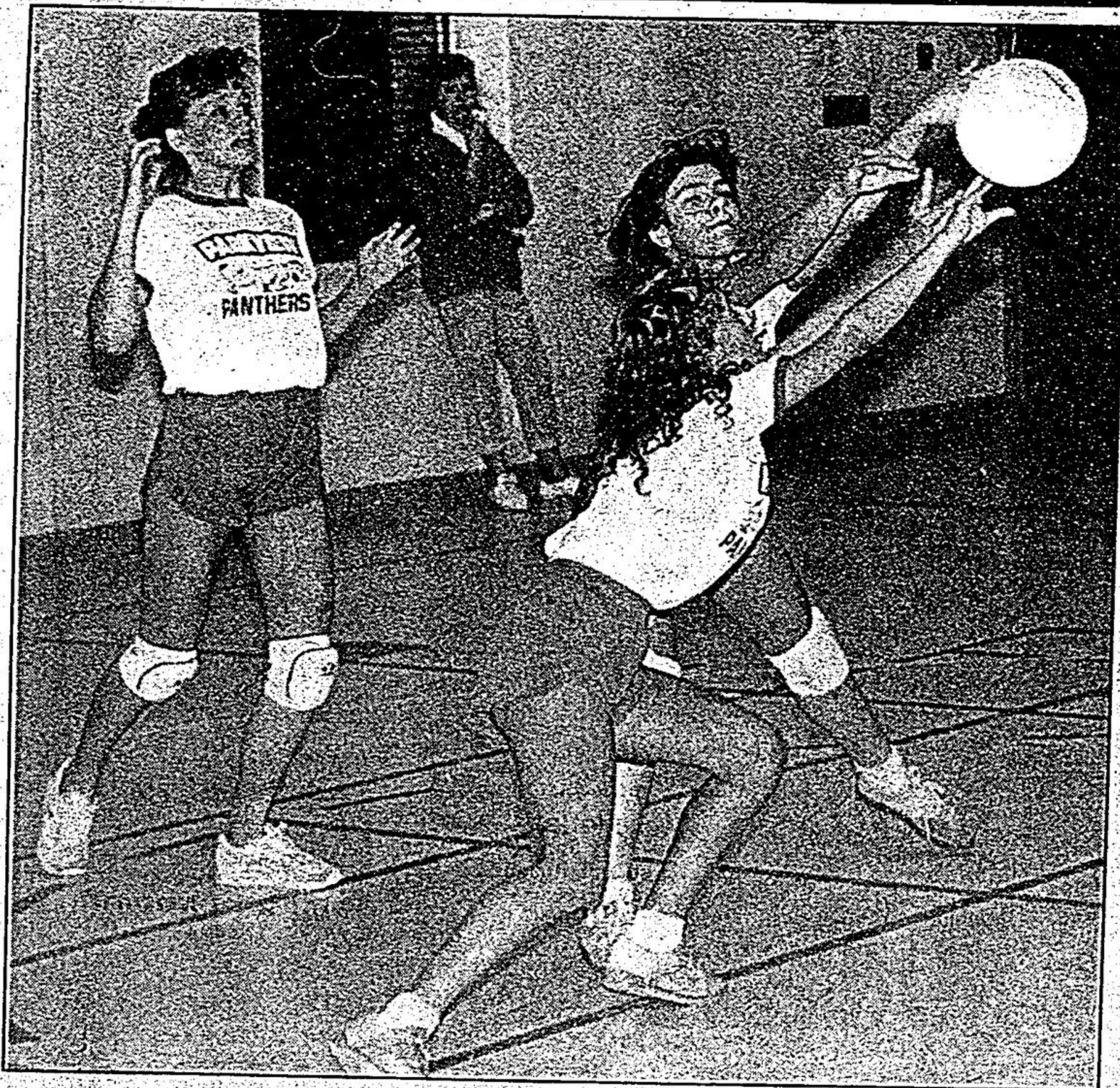

Cardinal girls win 3 straight in basketball

Markham's surprising Brother Andre Catholic High School, which barely won a Junior girls' basketball game last year, could finish this season well over the 500 mark.

The Cardinals went 4-4 at the halfway mark of this campaign, but coach Mary Deveaux figures a 7-1 second-half record is not out of reach.

And she could be right, since her 'flock' has picked up three straight victories in the last 10 days. The first was a particularly satisfying 46-36 decision over St. Robert's.

"We really dominated the game," said Deveaux. "Everything was working; our fast break ran well, the (defensive) press resulted in key turnovers, and the defence looked good."

Leading the defence was Enza Biadi, who shut down one of the well-known basketball Gaughans — this year it's Kim — and limited her to 12 points. Last time these two clubs met Gaughan collected 27 points.

Meanwhile, Unionville's Megan Griffin led the Cardinal attack with 13 points. Terri Wilkie had 12 points, Michelle Quinelle 11 and Tara Talbot eight.

The Cardinals had an easy time with Bayview, using 13-point performances from Quinelle and Cindy Keyes to record a 55-37 triumph. Griffin supplied 11 points.

But the problem in this and Brother Andre's 38-22 win over Thornlea on Wednesday has been poor play in the early going.

"We had a slow start on defence," said the coach. "We let Bayview score 18 points in the first quarter. But we outscored them 43-19 the rest of the game."

It was much the same against Thornlea, with the Cardinals behind 9-4 after the first quarter. But they struggled to a 13-13 half-time draw, then won the second half 25-9.

"We're not an overly strong, talented team so we can't afford to sit back," warned Deveaux, whose girls host local rival Mar-

kham District High School in a game Tuesday afternoon.

Meanwhile, Jill Murphy's Midget boys' volleyball team had a respectable performance in a four-team round-robin tournament it hosted last weekend.

The Cardinals beat Holy Cross and highly-touted Stouffville in two sets apiece, Holy Cross a second time 2-1, lost to Bayview in two sets, then dropped a 2-1 match against Stouffville.

"We played very well," assessed the coach. "It was our first time out and showed we're definitely going to be York Region contenders."

"We improved as the tournament went on and put the basics to good use on the court," she continued, adding strong performances came from Scott Chow, Eron Sluga, MVP Damien Williams and Patrick Valledor.
