

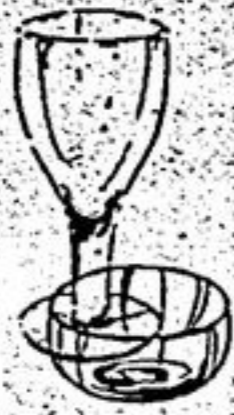
Christmas nears

Possession charge

UXBRIDGE TWP. — A 27-year-old Uxbridge Twp. resident has had his case adjourned to Nov. 26 following an appearance in Provincial Court, Newmarket, Wednesday.

Stuart Keeler, Conc. 1, Uxbridge, is charged with possession of narcotics for the purpose of trafficking.

A truck, said to belong to the accused, was investigated by York Regional Police Oct. 22 while parked on Main Street, Stouffville, near the Post Office. It was later towed to police headquarters in Newmarket.

Although several concealed weapons were allegedly found in the vehicle, investigators would neither deny or confirm this.

Community welfare at heart

STOUFFVILLE — "A tireless worker who cared for the whole community."

Rev. Janet Cawley of Stouffville United Church used these words to describe the contributions made by Mrs. Jim McCreight when she addressed family friends and relatives at the funeral service, Friday.

Mrs. McCreight, the former Viola Reeve, died Nov. 5 at Parkview Home, Stouffville. She was 84.

Rev. Cawley told how Mrs. McCreight's life had touched all areas of the community and beyond.

Her church association was important. She was president of the

United Church Women's Association and later the U.C.W. She served on the Congregational Board and as a teacher in the Sunday School.

It was back in 1956 that Mrs. McCreight turned her energies towards organizing the Stouffville Branch of the Canadian Cancer Society. Her interest in this work was life-long.

For many years, she was the Society's Memoriam Secretary.

During World War II, she was active in the work of the Canadian Red Cross. She was honored for her war effort in this regard. She also assisted in the packing of clothing bales for mission homes in Toronto. She was active in the

Stouffville Business and Professional Women's Club.

Mrs. McCreight twice served as President of the Altona Women's Institute and was honored with a Life Membership. She held a position on the executive of the Ontario South, (W.I.) District.

Mrs. McCreight was proud of her association with the Federal Liberal Party. She was a delegate to the Convention in Ottawa when Pierre Trudeau won the Liberal leadership.

As a receptionist-secretary in the office of Dr. Herb Free and later Dr. Bill Murphy and Dr. Howard Rosenberg, Mrs. McCreight gained an even wider circle of friends.

She was the first woman trustee on the school board at S.S. No. 19, Markham and the first woman school board secretary-treasurer in the whole of York County.

She helped organize the ladies' sewing circle on Markham's Ninth Line.

Mrs. McCreight, the former Viola Reeve, was born in Toronto, the daughter of Arthur and Nancy (Stover) Reeve. She later resided in Markham Village and following her marriage, on the Ninth Line of Markham.

Following retirement from the farm in 1948, Jim and Viola moved to Stouffville, first to Main Street East and then Church

Street North. They later took up residence in Parkview Home.

Mrs. McCreight was proud of her family — two daughters, Barbara, (Mrs. Ken Vale), of St. Catharines; Isobel, (Mrs. Lorne Emmerson), of Markham; one son Tom in East York and five grandchildren, Kent and Cheryl Emmerson and Lori Diamond; Sandra Davis and Jeff Vale.

Mr. McCreight resides at Parkview.

Pall-bearers were — Kent Emmerson, Murray Emmerson, James Stanbury, Paul Stanbury, Jeff Vale and Richard Diamond. Interment was at St. Andrew's Cemetery, Markham.
