# United Way campaign nearing its 1986 goal

Whitchurch-Stouffville residents have less than two weeks in which to put the town's 1986 United Way fund-raising campaign over the top. "We're starting to put the big push on," Stouffville campaign chairman Hank DeGroot said in an interview Monday. He noted that \$31,500 of the \$40,000 goal has been raised with 10 days left to go. Across the region, \$763,000 has been collected out of an anticipated \$1.25 million.

Mr. DeGroot is confident Stouffville's target amount will be achieved by the Nov. 21 deadline. "From experience, we know that a lot of money comes in during the last couple of weeks," he said. The chairman hopes businesses and individuals will follow the lead of two major corporate donors, Cable Tech and McNeil Pharmaceutical (Canada) Ltd., which contributed \$11,718 and \$10,190 respectively.

"The big industries came through big, so I hope other businesses will follow," Mr. DeGroot said. "They have 10 days in which to do so." A team of canvassers, including John Marshall and Pat Courage, will be out making the rounds trying to collect all possible pledges.
