**Road upgrading  
a top priority  
for ratepayers**

CLAREMONT — Improving the condition of roads in Claremont is a top priority for the hamlet's 1986-87 ratepayers executive.

Former director Bob Nemish was elevated to the position of

president when Claremont and District Community Association held its elections Oct. 8.

Mr. Nemish said he hopes the association will "provide a focus for the community" and serve as a co-ordinating body to address residents' concerns.

The Central Street resident described a present road survey as the "first major push" of the new term.

Questionnaires are being distributed to Claremont residents, inquiring whether they prefer road improvements to be made to Old Brock Road within the hamlet, or to the west along Durham Region Road 5.

Results will be tabulated to provide future direction when dealing with both the municipal and regional levels of government.

Executive members for 1986-87 also include vice-president Marion Peddie and secretary/treasurer Sue Smith, plus directors Glenna Yoshida, Jim Lindsay, Karsten Smith, John Marks, Bill Edgar, Brian Kerman and Lyn Craig. The following standing committees have been formed: program, finance, membership, government affairs and communications.

The CDCA meets in Claremont's Masonic Hall the second Wednesday of each month at 8 p.m. The next session is scheduled for Dec. 10.
