Books are bugged

STOUFFVILLE — When the bell rings....!

A new security system in the library at Stouffville Dist. Secondary School will pay for itself in three to five years says chief librarian Audrey Fullerton.

The way it works, a metal clip is attached to each of the 10,000 books. If a student or teacher leaves and neglects to 'sign out', the alarm sounds.

If the proper procedure is followed, the clip is desensitized and the alarm is silenced.

The initial cost was high, about \$12,000, Audrey explains. This figure was shared by the board, (\$5,000); the students' council, (\$4,000) and the school, (\$3,000), as a capital expense. It wasn't just a dollar problem,

Audrey says, but the frustration of requiring reference materials and finding them not there. This was continually being experienced by both students and staff, she claims.

With respect to materials being removed and never returned, Au-

drey explains that with some books costing upwards of \$100, it doesn't take long to add up to a sizeable figure.

Security systems are now 'standard equipment' in all secondary school libraries across York Region.






