

SDSS beats U'ville but not Pickering

Stouffville Secondary coach Jim Fletcher predicted a showdown with Unionville in the Durham-York (DYSSA) junior volleyball finals last week.

Both schools had already exchanged greetings in the York Region championship. Unionville beat the Spartan boys in that best-of-three confrontation for the crown. The ever-optimistic Fletcher wanted a rematch in the DYSSA finals and assured everyone that his junior hitters would take back what really belonged to them.

Well, the skipper got the show-down he wanted and Unionville went down two games straight 15-10

and 15-10. "The guys were just elated by that," he admitted.

However, the re-match wasn't for the DYSSA crown. After defeating Unionville, Stouffville advanced to the final against a tall group of athletes from Pickering.

"Pickering came up hot and they were big," said Fletcher, whose squad lost the war 15-5 and 15-10. "They're size just got to us. They were so big; they were hitting over the top of our blockers."
