

Peewee Clippers qualify for final

The Stouffville Peewee Clippers and their ever-faithful entourage of fans trekked into Sutton last weekend for a tournament and trucked out with a berth in next Sunday's final.

The hockey squad, sponsored by Stouffville District Credit Union, rolled over Bradford and host Sutton with relative ease. The latter contest ended 10-1.

Captain Jason Underwood, selected the Clipper star of the game against Bradford, provided

some outstanding passing plays and dramatic end to end rushes. Brandon Pridham, David Caramanico and Bill Pride, worked a strong defence and penalty-killing unit.

The fiery, high-scoring line of Underwood, Dayle Lewis and Jason Whitebread stayed hot in game two against Sutton. While Brad Blacktopp kept Sutton players held up in their own end, the Clippers closed the first period with a 3-1 lead.

Stouffville popped in five unanswered goals in the second

Underwood scored a shorthanded goal in the last period, off a perfect pass from Whitebread. Lewis stubbornly skated the length of the ice to convert the final Stouffville goal. Steady goaltending from Dan Wilson and Baron Ellis also contributed to the Clippers' entry into this weekend's final.
