Markham will be all aglow

MARKHAM — Markham's "Gala Festival of Lights", sponsored by the Old Markham Village Business Improvement Area board, will be held this Friday, Dec. 5 from 7 to 11 p.m.

The Main Street will be closed to traffic during this time.

A 30-foot blue spruce Christmas tree, donated by the Markham Office of Family Trust and decorated with 600 twinkling lights, will be officially lit at 7:20 p.m. by Ronald McDonald. The tree will be located on the north-west corner of Hwy. 7 and 48.

An overhead ribbon effect of clear lights will run the entire length of Main Street. Each of the gazebos will contain 300 lights.

In total, more than 10,000 lights will glow for this special event. All stores and restaurants will be open.

Fifty miniature decorated Christmas trees, each four feet tall, will be placed in planters. Wreaths will be attached to all hydro poles.

Entertainment for the occasion will be provided by groups of carollers; The Whitevale Bell-Ringers; the Sutherland Pipe Band and the Fort York Fire and Drum Color Party. Animal characters will hand out candy canes to the children.

Oh yes, Santa Claus will be there—in the lobby of The Tremont House.

The evening's master of ceremonies is Tom Shea, President and Chairman of Family Trust. Invited guests will include Mayor Carole Bell; members of Markham Town Council; Michael Butcher, Executive Assistant of the Markham Stouffville Hospital; Dr. James MacLean, Chief of Medical Staff; Markham Stouffville Hospital and Family Trust Branch Manager, Betty Webber.

There will be hayrides for the kids. Coffee and hot chocolate will be served.
