Bantams need intensity to maintain first place

The Edwards-Murphy Bantam Clippers blitzed Beaverton 13-3 in exhibition play last Friday and downed Port Perry 5-2 in a league game Monday night.

The defence, the give-and-go and the heads-up playmaking all came together in Beaverton, said Stouffville coach Kerry Keller, but then it fell apart Monday despite the victory.

Up 4-0 against Port Perry — with three of those goals on the power-play — the Clippers looked poised for another near-perfect performance. "We built up a 4-0 lead and then had a total relapse," lamented Keller. Port Perry managed to bang home a couple markers in the process.

"When we got the lead against Beaverton, we kept pouring it on, but last night the intensity just left my players. I don't have any explanations. We quit hustling."

Despite the inconsistent hustle, the Clippers are in first place with a solid 7-2-1 record. Danny Larmer is the latest hot gunner for Stouffville, firing eight goals in the last two games. Kevin Blacktopp collected a hat trick against Beaverton and Kevin Francis topped off Larmer's four-goal splurge on Monday with a single netter.

A new addition to the Clipper lineup is Collingwood defenceman Jamie Shower. Shower, a tall, strapping blueliner, played junior C out of Collingwood before moving to Stouffville recently.

The Clippers were nailed with a barrage of stick infractions and one

player was handed an unsportsmanlike conduct in Monday's contest. "Penalties (like these) could cost us in the playoffs," warned Keller.
