Sex case is probed

Toronto and Regional Crime Stoppers and York Regional Police are requesting the assistance of the public in an effort to arrest a suspect for Sexual Assault.

During the early evening of Nov. 28, this year at 7 p.m. a woman was sitting at her desk at her place of employment (Humber Valley Real Estate Co., 7055 Islington Ave., Woodbridge.)

The suspect in this case knocked on the door and indicated he wanted to use the telephone because his car had broken down. The victim and suspect then had a brief conversation. While the victim was sitting at her desk, the suspect walked around and grabbed her in a bear hug and tried to kiss her.

The victim swung around and hit the suspect in the face. She tried to grab the phone but couldn't and during the struggle was knocked to the floor and sexually assaulted by this man.

The victim once again tried to hit the suspect by hitting him in the groin. At that point the telephone rang and the suspect fled from the office.

The suspect in the case is described as:

Male, white, 5' 9", 195 lbs., heavy build, brown hair to shoulders - parted in the middle, about 26 years old. He was wearing a beige bomber jacket with a short sleeved navy blue t-shirt and appeared as if he was on drugs.

A re-enactment of this crime will be shown on CITY-TV this Thursday on the 6 p.m. and 10 p.m. news.

Other appeals for help in identifying this criminal will be made by Crime Stoppers on radio stations, local newspapers, Cable Stations and CKVR-TV in Barrie.

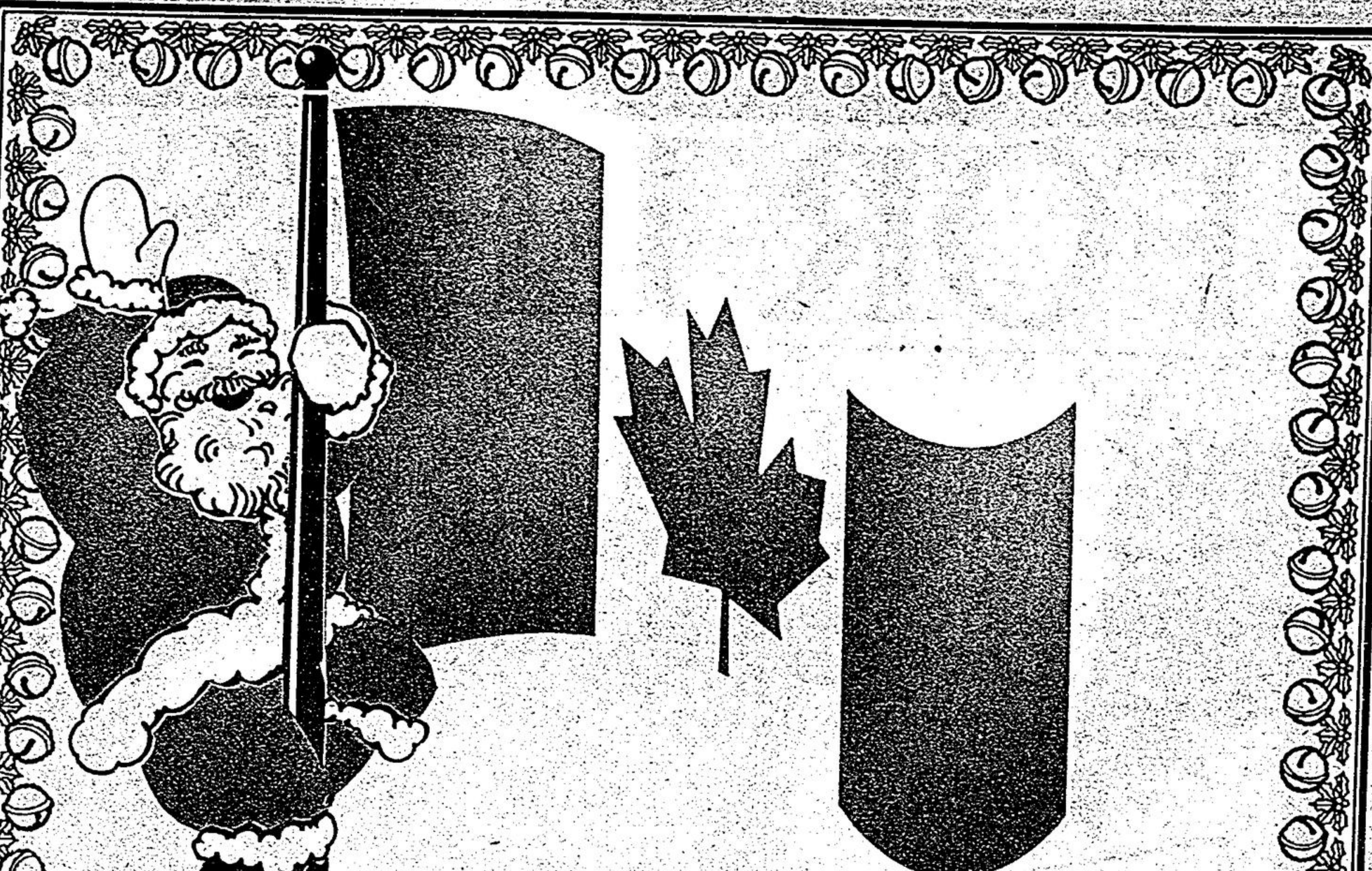
Two stores broken into
