## HAPPY BIRTHDAY

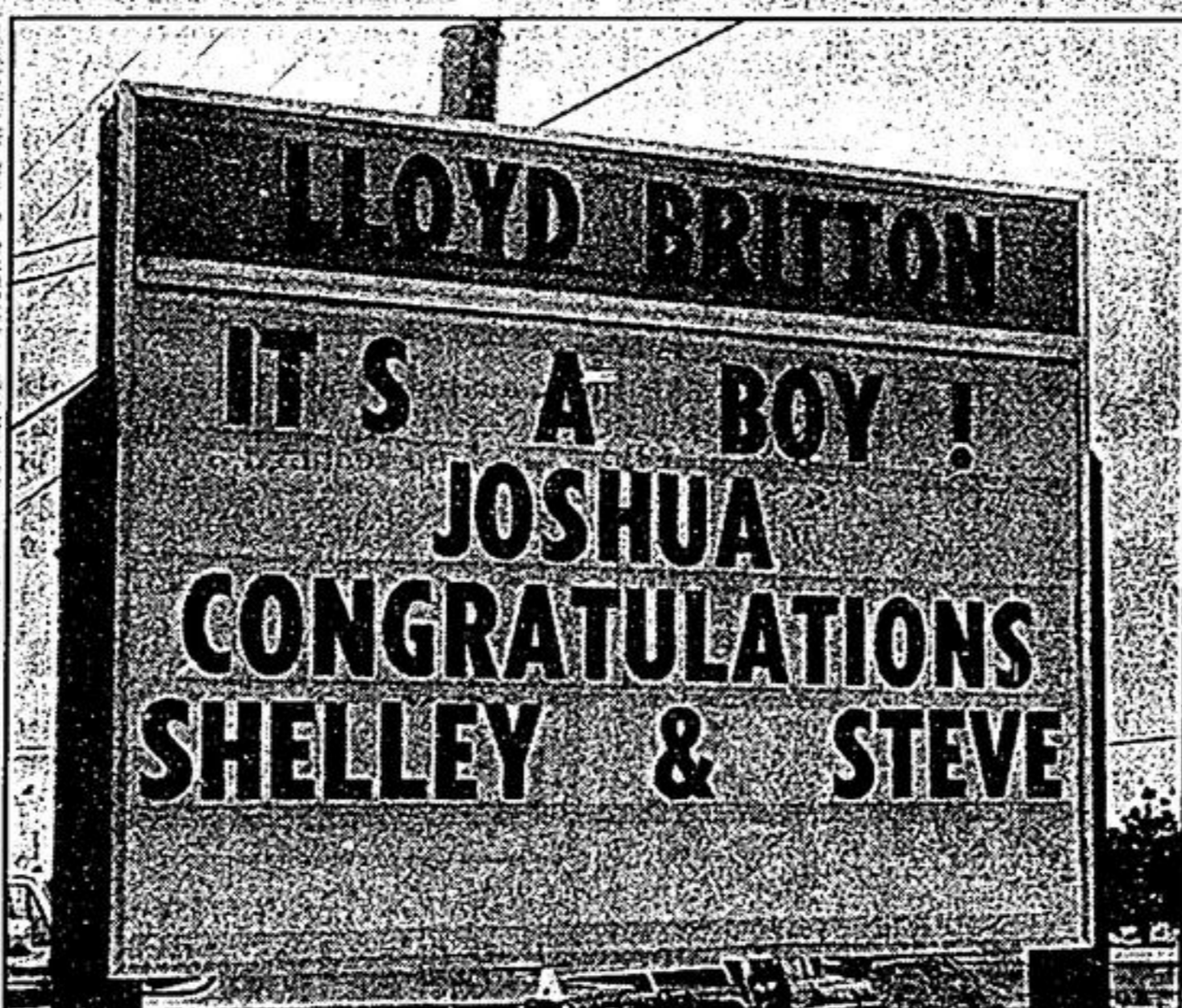
