

Mr. Hostetler was held in high regard as a head grower on the staff of Dunn's Greenhouses, St. Catharines. When he moved to Stouffville in 1959, his skills were utilized by Herb Cossey, then of the Stouffville Floral Company.

Following retirement, Mr. Hostetler turned his hand to photography.

"You're just the man I'm looking for," was the response by Ted Cadieux of Cadieux Studio, Main Street, Stouffville, when Mr. Hostetler enquired concerning a position as darkroom technician with the firm. His skills were later retained by Mr. Cadieux's successor, George Ross.

ough Centenary Hospital. He was 83.
