Juried show coming

Artists throughout York Region are invited to enter an upcoming juried drawing show at Stouffville's Latcham Gallery.

Drawings — original, recent works executed in any media — must be hand delivered to the gallery, 65 Main St. West, Stouffville, along with an entry form on either of two dates: Wednesday, Feb. 4, from 10 a.m. to 8:30 p.m., or Thursday, Feb. 5, between 10 a.m. and the final deadline of 5 p.m.

Submissions will be juried on Saturday, Feb. 7, by a panel consisting of June Drutz, Howard Gerry and Ann Ziegler. The show opens Sunday, Feb. 15, from 2 to 4 p.m., and continues through to March 8.

Complete details of each work must be included on a label and attached to the back of the drawing. Entries, not exceeding 4' by 6', should be suitably framed and ready for hanging.

An entry fee of \$10 will be charged for a maximum of two works. Cash prizes will be awarded the winners.
