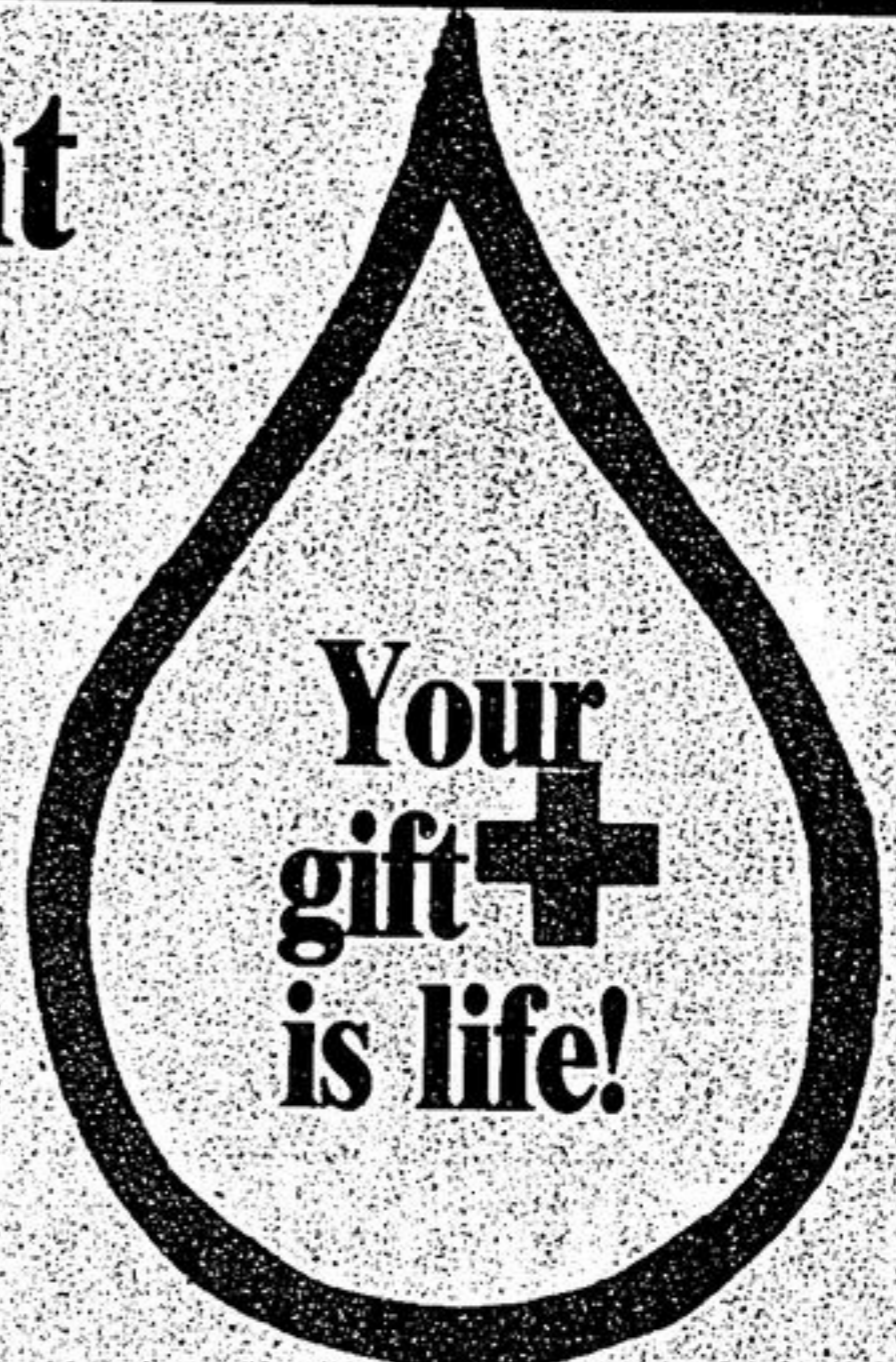

# Help create rental units for people with special housing needs.

### Special provincial funding for 3,000 units.

The Government of Ontario has made a special commitment to fund 3,000 new, non-profit housing units primarily dedicated to disadvantaged people.

Who will this program help? Mainly people who are physically, developmentally or psychiatrically handicapped, battered women, homeless people and other socially disadvantaged persons.

The Ministries of Housing, Health, and Community and Social Services are working together to help people throughout Ontario who require a combination of support-care services and housing.

Projects that house low-income families and senior citizens as well as disadvantaged groups will be considered. Innovative housing projects for disadvan-

taged, low-income, single people will also be considered on a demonstration basis.

### Attend our briefing sessions this February.

Interested community groups and non-profit organizations are invited to attend orientation sessions on the development of housing with support services. Meetings will be held in February at each Regional Office of the Ministry of Housing.

Representatives from the Ministries involved will be on hand to speak and to answer questions.

Local community organizations wishing to sponsor non-profit housing projects can apply for government grants to cover the costs of establishing non-profit housing corporations.

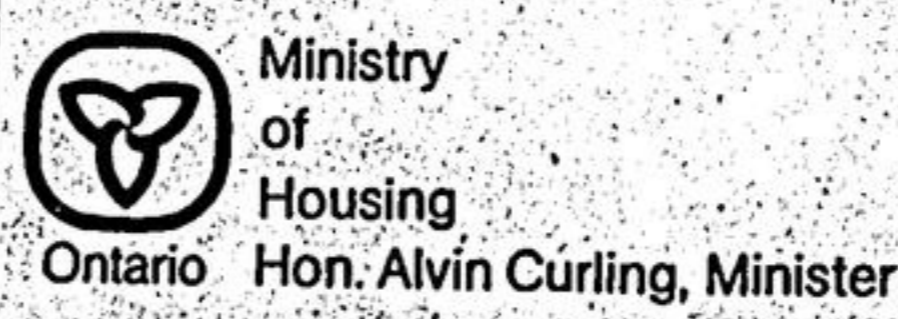
### Call now for complete details.

Preliminary applications indicating an intent to develop a housing project with support services are to be submitted by March 31, 1987. Eligibility depends on the degree and nature of care provided.

The federal government, through Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation, will provide mortgage loan insurance for all projects funded by this program.
