"Actually, we're looking pretty good," she continued. "The girls are inexperienced. They're just not sure where the ball's going to go, but they're working hard on the court."


So far, she's pleased with the efforts of Captain Tara Talbot, assistant Michelle Quinnelle and Lisa Rotondi.
