Archbishop leads seminar on justice

Archbishop Ed Scott will be discussing the necessity of Christian involvement in world problems at a conference being presented by the Let Justice Roll Committee on Feb. 1 at St. Philip's On-the-hill Anglican Church in Unionville.

Sandra Pearson, chairman of the local Let Justice Roll committee, said that the Archbishop's speech on Spirituality of Social Commitment is "a call for Christians to be committed beyond their local parish."

The discussion will look at why Christians should become involved in such issues as apartheid


and world hunger. The conference is meant to be an "information consciousness-raiser," Mrs. Pearson said.

Mrs. Pearson said she looks at the world as a community rather than as competing societies.

The discussion is part of the 10 Days for World Development conference taking place across Canada from Jan. 30 to Feb. 9.

Let Justice Roll is an organization that has been in existence over 13 years but was only established in Unionville last September.
