Browsing is fruitful at second-hand shop

A few days ago I was in the company of a television interviewer and a variety of successful business men and women.

No, I wasn't at a gala opening of a new theatre. Neither was I working out at an exclusive health spa, nor dining at a glitzy restaurant.

I was, once again, bargain hunting with the best of them at Ethel's Pre-Owned Apparel and Things in the Markham Mall, east of Wootton Way on Hwy 7.

Ethel Sparaga operates a unique kind of second hand department store, selling a wide variety of items on consignment for a current total of 943 clients, some as far away as Australia and England.

The client receives half the selling price. The selection includes clothing for men, women and children; shoes, jewellery, hand bags, housewares, draperies, and sheers, bedding, books, small appliances and toys.

Shopping at Ethel's is like having a one-stop garage sale all year round. My last few purchases have included a huge box of Barbie dolls and clothing, and a bur-

gundy velvet Highland Queen blazer for \$7.50, and a pair of leather dress shoes that Mr. C bought for \$5. (It was so unlike him that I gave him an aspirin and sent him straight to bed.)

Men's suits are a terrific buy at Ethel's. The most expensive is \$100 for a Gucci original, though the majority of three piece suits are \$50 or less. Most of them look brand new. With a few alterations, most men could be wearing a designer suit for \$100 or less.

Women have a wide and diverse selection of fashions to choose from. Customers can choose from designers such as Maggie Reeves, Issey Miyake, Chloe and Wayne Clark at a fraction of the

original price. They can also outfit themselves for business or leisure from a good selection of lower priced items. A Marjorie Hamilton pin-wale cord shirtdress, for example, is \$20.

And for those whose girth is rapidly expanding, there is a maternity section which features a pink and white seersucker drop waist dress for \$30.

One loyal customer explained that she has been shopping at Ethel's for 4 1/2 years. "If you were to look in my closet, 75 per cent of my clothes, for the office and travel were bought here. I can dress in designer clothes and not spend a fortune."

One of my favourite finds this trip was a pair of jeans that fit as if they were made for me and looked as if they have never been worn.

(They were probably bought by one of those bargain-crazed shoppers who will buy anything if it's on sale, even if it doesn't fit. You know the type.) At \$25, they were less than half the original retail price.

Outfitting children can be hard on the pocket book, but Ethel offers an alternative. Why buy expensive fashions to have paint and grape juice spilled on them?

There is a good stock of play and dress clothes at Ethel's at reasonable prices. My six year old and I are going back to investigate a boy's three piece suit for \$19.95. Contrary to his father's favourite fashion accessory is a tie.

The fifth anniversary of the store's opening is coming up in May and Ethel's excitement infects those around her. "This is my own little world and I love it," she enthused.

Take an hour or two and browse through the racks at Ethel's Pre-Owned Apparel and Things. There is a good chance you'll pick up on the excitement too. And don't forget to tell her. Deb sent you.

The Planning Act and The Parkway Belt Planning and Development Act

Take notice that the Town of Markham has requested the Minister of Municipal Affairs to revoke the Parkway Belt Land Use Regulations filed as Ontario Regulation 473/73 in the Town of Markham, as they apply to certain lands located south of Highway 7, both east and west of Leslie Street, in Lots 9 & 10, Concession II and III, Town of Markham. The Land Use Regulations are proposed to be replaced by Town of Markham Zoning By-Law No. 15-87 to permit industrial development.

All submissions in support of, or in opposition to, the application described above, and received by the Minister of Municipal Affairs c/o Plans Administration Branch, 777 Bay Street, 14th Floor, Toronto, M5G 2E5 on or before the 19th day of February, 1987 will be fully considered before a final decision is made.

In addition, under Section 46(10) of the Planning Act, 1983, any interested person may request a hearing by the Ontario Municipal Board on any application for amendment to, or revocation of, the Parkway Belt Land Use Regulations.
