Bill Thornhill with two, Wally Crowder, Joe Infurnari, Gary Husbands and Clint Dickinson led Greens to victory.

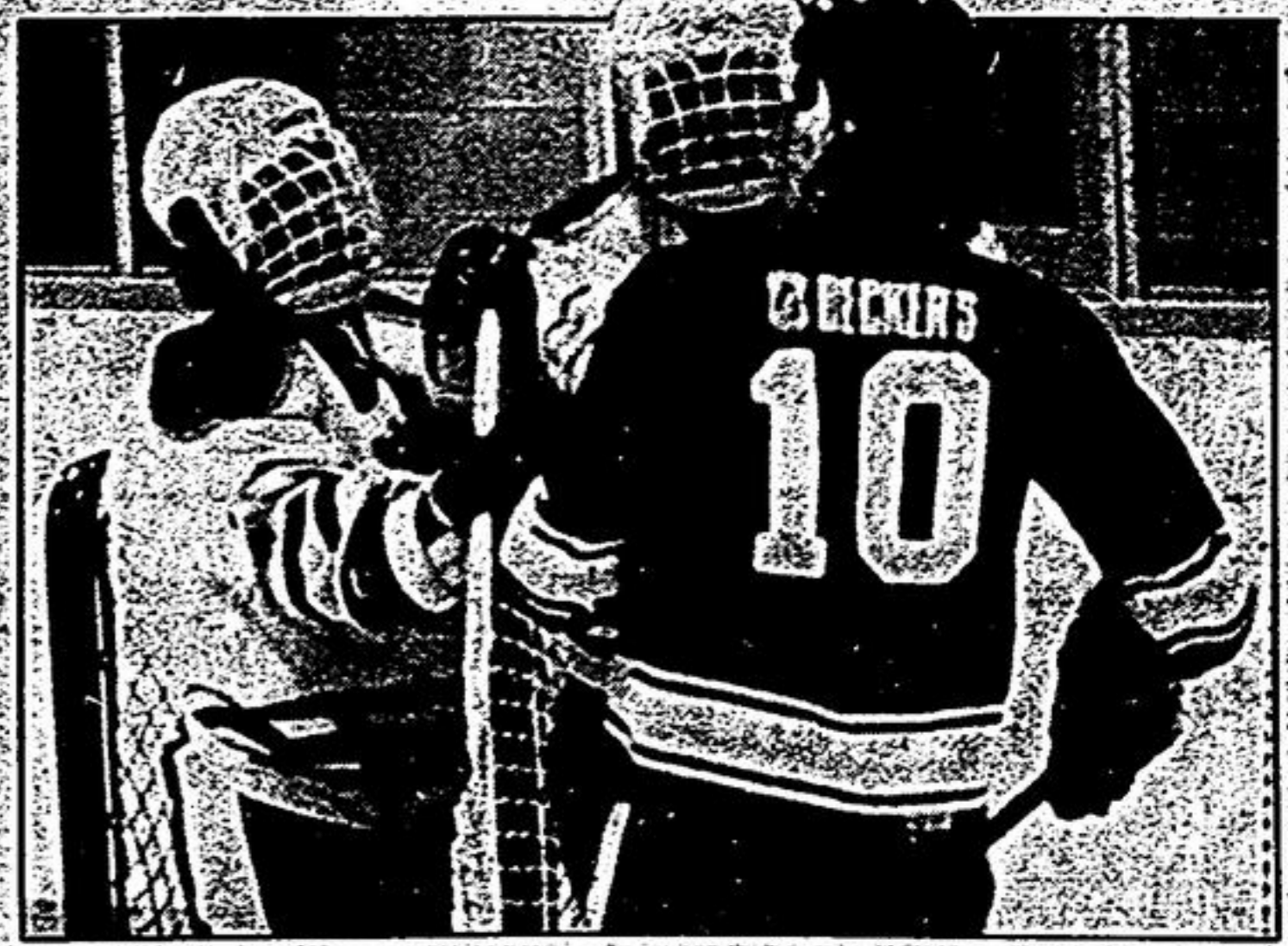
Dave Turner netted the Whalers only marker.

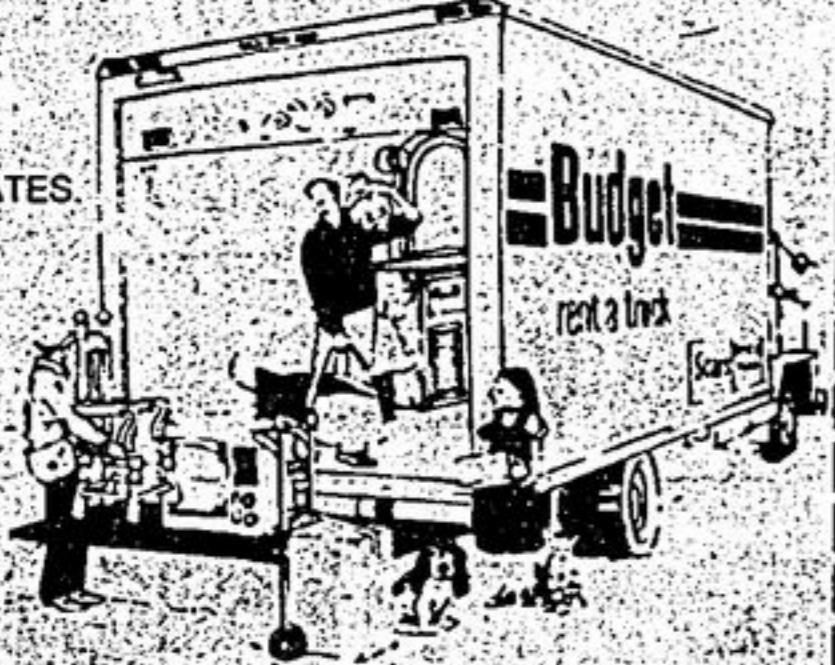
