

# Recreation services studied

A public meeting held last Wednesday by the Recreation Office gave residents and representatives of sports leagues a chance to air their views on facilities in Whitechurch-Stouffville.

The meeting took place at the Ballantrae Community Centre and was well attended.

Members of Council, including

the Mayor, and Recreation Office staff, were on hand to answer questions.

Along with the unveiling of plans for the extension of Latham Hall, presentations were made by a number of community recreation groups.

Representatives of the Stouffville Figure Skating Club, Whitechurch-Stouffville Soccer Club, Ballantrae Tennis Club and the Softball User Group Committee spoke at the meeting.

Each had their own particular concerns, but the consensus was that the town needs more and better recreation facilities.

The soccer club repeated their request for lights at the field by the Recreation Centre, something they've been asking for for years.

They even offered to pay a portion of the installation price themselves.

However, as with almost every

other request for improvement in facilities, the town said lack of funds was the main problem.

"We just don't have the dollars," said Ward 5 Councillor Wilf Morley, Chairman of Recreation and Cultural Services Committee. "It's a matter of money."

Improvements are also needed at the Ballantrae Tennis Club, and Diamond One in Memorial Park has a serious drainage problem which must be addressed in the near future.

The need for an indoor pool run by the Recreation Office was also discussed. At the moment, the only indoor pool in town is Slater's Pool in Vandorf.

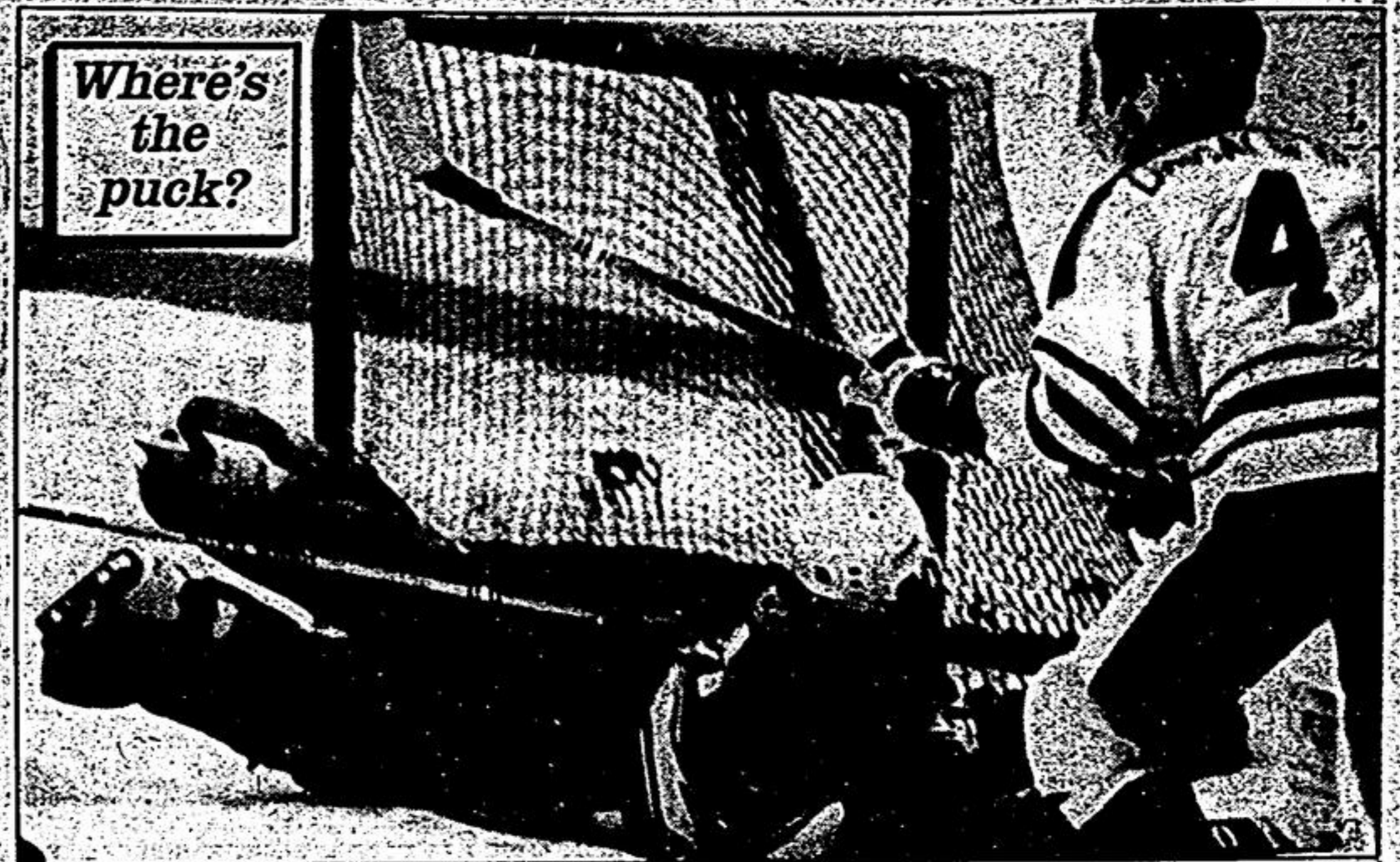
## Claremont minor ball
