

# Markham wins curling tourney

The Markham District High School girl's curling team used a near-perfect game to win last weekend's Durham/York Secondary School Association curling tournament.

Skip Diane McLean, 17, "was really hot" according to coach Doug Walker after his squad beat Cannington's Brock Secondary School 15-10 in game one, and

Whitby's Anderson Collegiate 9-5 in the championship.

McLean made a difficult "angle take-out" early in the first game when her rink was trailing to turn the contest around.

"Diane was so consistent she didn't miss a shot," her coach raved.

Twice in the Brock game the Markham rink was down by five stones. Walker said the team's

front end which consisted of two 15-year-olds, lead Debbie Green and second Lisa Rowsell, missed their shots on the first five ends but "after that the whole team played exceptionally well."

The spectacular performance of McLean with the solid support of vice Sharon Magnon, 17, allowed Markham to come back and defeat Brock by five stones.

Walker had the girls use a draw-

round style, rather than playing an aggressive hit game. After the team's initial problems, the girls were able to set up blockers out in front of the ring and then drop stones in behind them.

Markham now advances to the provincial playdowns in Sault Ste. Marie in late March.

The boys' team didn't fare as well, finishing runner-up to a tough Thornhill team. It started

with a win over Uxbridge, but fell to Thornhill.

Walker said the guys "just weren't able to make the shots" but added that it had a lot to do with Thornhill's "excellent play".

The Markham team consisted of skip Derek Green, 19, lead Craig Goslin, 18; second John McVie, 18, vice John Cowan, 18. Rob Shepherd was spare.

The squad battles Kingston in the best-of-five second-round series. Games one and two are scheduled for the Stouffville Recreation Centre, today at 5 p.m. and tomorrow at 4 p.m.

Coach Kerry Keller (whose squad won last year's OMHA BB title) is pleased to start the series at home, noting "that's a definite advantage for us."

Also, a coin toss after Sunday's tangle will determine the location of game three to be played next week.

"If we win the toss, that would be perfect. We wouldn't have to travel at all," Keller said.

Driving from Kingston to Stouffville on a week night would be hard on the Kingston team, he explained.

Keller is unfamiliar with Kingston's style of play, admitting "I don't know a thing about them. We've never seen them play."
