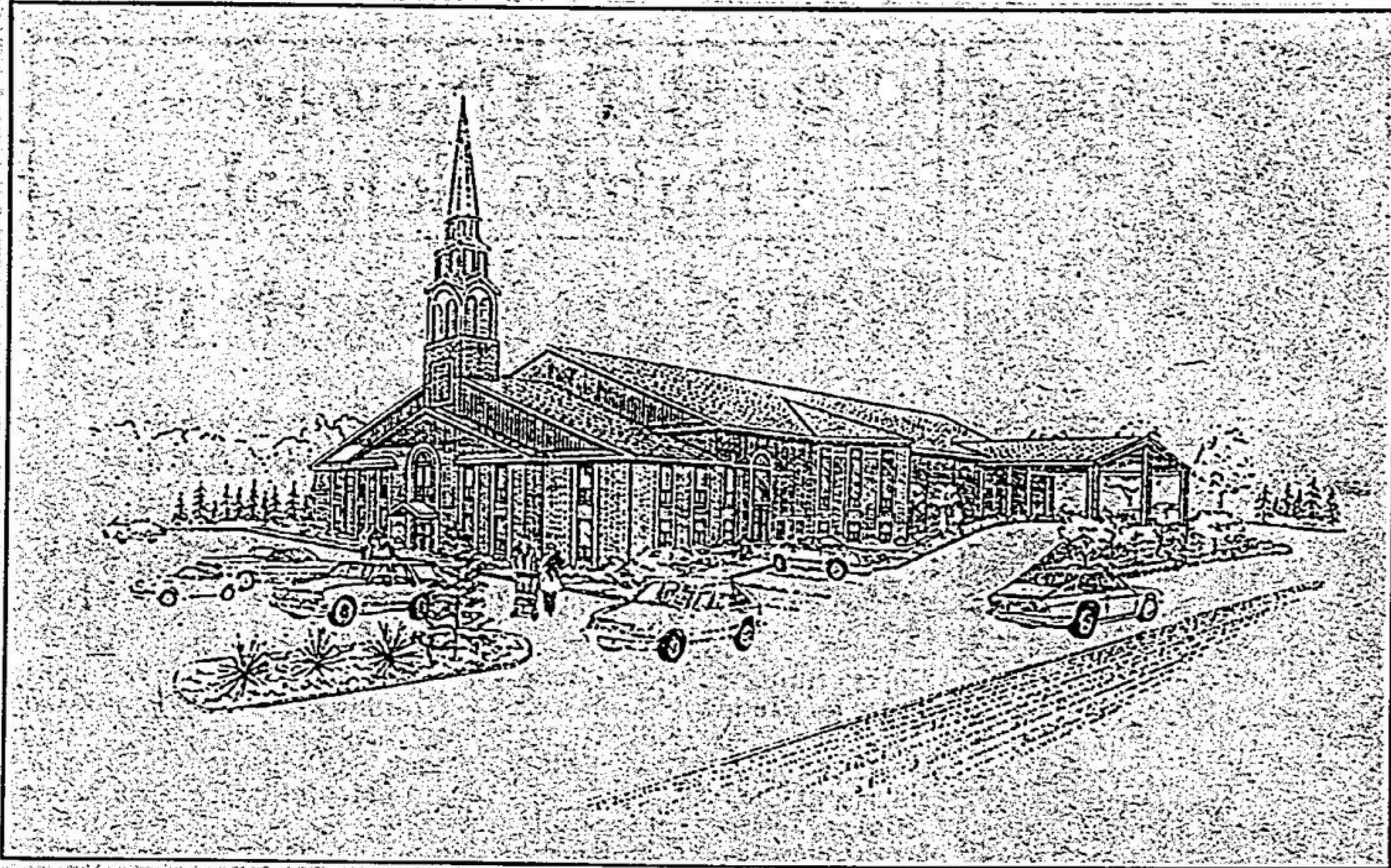

Locals to help build church

In the next ten months a 16th Ave. site will be transformed, as a beautiful 28,000 square foot structure rises from the ground — with the help of its congregation.

Construction on the new Unionville Alliance Church begins next month.

The 1,100 seat sanctuary will be complemented with administrative and Christian Education space enabling effective ministry to the growing congregation and community.

The congregation is excited ab-

out the project — not just because they'll once again have a place to call home but because they'll be active in the process.

The builder, Don Hawkey Construction, allows for maximum involvement from the local congregation.

This not only speeds up construction time line and lowers cost, but fosters a spirit among those involved — much like the barn raising bees of our past.

The project will be kicked off with a sod-turning ceremony Sunday, March 15 at 12:30 p.m. Im-

mediately after the 11-a.m. Worship Service at Unionville Public School the congregation will make its way over to the new property for the ceremony.

Denominational and political dignitaries will be on hand for the event. Everyone is welcome to attend.

"This new facility is not just for us. It's for this community," said Pastor Dave Petrescue. "We want it to be a place where people's lives and homes are made strong — to the glory of God."

And mothers need not worry about their young. The Christian Women of Unionville are offering free nursery care at the Central United Church at 131 Main St. during the coffee hour.

Entry costs \$3. Seniors get in for \$2.
