Markham boys blown out

 Markham's Midget boys basketball team couldn't deal with Dunbarton's speed or outside shooting, and the result was a crushing 83-49 loss in the York-Durham high school finals.

George Kraus, who coached the squad with Andrew Bos, admitted quite candidly, "It was a superior team that beat us."

Markham found itself in a hole after the opening minute of play when Darren Nichiporik, the second highest scorer on the team, left the game with a badly

injured ankle after attempting a lay-up shot.

"A big part of our offense was lost right there," the coach said. Nichiporik had averaged about 15 points per game.

According to the coach, Markham's strategy was to "pack the defense inside the foul line and shut off Dunbarton's speed."

Kraus said his boys did "come out pressing." But the problem was Dunbarton has a lot of good outside shooters and they were making those outside shots.

This type of play had been very

successful for the locals right through semi-final action, but Dunbarton's outsider shooters (particularly David Jackson) "just didn't miss," Kraus said.

Markham was in a catch-22 situation. If it hadn't pressed then Dunbarton would have taken the ball to the hoop and scored on lay-up shots.

Another factor that didn't help his team was the fact that Markham had to wait almost five hours at Stouffville for the championship game, after defeating Pickering 52-41 in the semi-finals. Kraus said he felt Markham

was just outclassed in this match-up. Dunbarton had lost only two games all season.

"Their team was something special that day," the skipper assessed. "We could have met that team on a high and still lost by 30 points."

High scorer for the locals, as he has been all year, was Paul Pachis. The coach also mentioned 6'2" forward Matt Stewart as a player to watch for next season. "Matt started off awkward but has become a real factor now. He rebounds very well."

Midgets take the lead

Stouffville's Beckers Milk Midget Clippers have taken an early lead in their best-of-five OMHA BB semi-final series against Midland.

Last Sunday in Midland the Clippers came up with a strong performance to win game one 4-3. Sean McQuigge's two goals led the scoring, while singles came from Kirk Smythe and Jason Borthwick.

This series is the first meeting between the teams this season, and Stouffville manager Maurice Hamilton admitted his boys knew very little about Midland.

"They're a fairly good team; they had about the same amount

of points as us," he said. "We're pretty evenly matched."

Last season Midland played in the OMHA A division, but they were dropped to BB for this year. The OMHA determines the level a team competes in according to the population of the town.

The next two outings are slated for the Stouffville Recreation Centre this weekend, and with a little luck the Clippers could take the series without having to hit the road again.

"They'll all be close games," Hamilton predicted. Game two was played last night and game three is set for Sunday at 4 p.m.

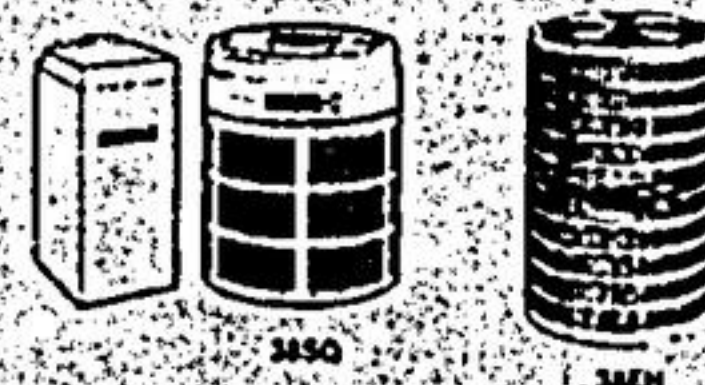
