Wallace won all four of her bouts with Ippon and finished first in her division; Elrich did the same thing in two bouts against higher-ranked opponents.

Calbert, who was just promoted to green belt, finished second in her category.

Calbert was busy in earlier tournaments, winning two fights and placing first in her division at a Scarborough competition.

Brent Manuel won two categories. Richard Clark was second in his section and Jamie Bilby third in his.

Manuel and Calbert were second at another tourney, while Nicol Sargent and Ryan Hatton took firsts. Sargent and Manuel had thirds at a Durham College competition.

Meanwhile, the Markham Judo Club was the locale for the annual Markham Parks and Recreation tournament, held recently. Classes from three areas — German Mills Public School, MJC, and Markham District High School (MDHS) — took part.

The 15 German Mills students won four firsts, five seconds and six thirds. MDHS's nine representatives had three firsts, five seconds and a third. MJC's eight students took four firsts, a second

and three thirds.
