Name and address changes are the responsibility of the Provincial Assessment Department. Due to the massive postal code changes in the town, extra staff were assigned to update mailing addresses.

The Treasury Department has used the Assessment Department's updated property, names and addresses for tax billing purposes. This could preclude some late ownership and address changes being incorporated in the tax billing.

If you have not received your tax bill by March 12th, 1987, contact the Treasury Department for a duplicate.

Failure to receive a tax bill does not eliminate the responsibility for payment of taxes or the penalty charges for late payment.

REAL ESTATE TIPS

HOW TO ACT WHEN YOU'RE SHOWING YOUR HOUSE TO A BUYER
