To the natives of Stouffville, Bob Davies is a comparative newcomer, a fledgling resident who, with wife Celina, arrived on the local scene just three years ago.

However, it's safe to say this same 49-year-old picker and singer has done more to boost the town than many would do in a lifetime.

"I just kind of stumbled on it," says Bob in recalling how he and Celina happened to stop off in Stouffville during a house-hunting sojourn into the north country. "I'm happy I did," he adds convincingly.

Stouffville's happy also. For Bob promotes the town everywhere he goes.

Born in Verdun, Quebec, Bob literally grew up with a guitar in his hand and a song in his heart. He began singing professionally at age 15.

Widely travelled, Bob has performed in many states across the U.S.A. as well as Australia. He's also rubbed shoulders with some of the world's top singing celebrities including Sarah Vaughan, Mel Torme, Buck Owens, Sammy Davis Jr. and more. His 4-piece band was called "The Rhythm Jesters."

"Sure, it was exciting," he says, "but being on the road continuously can get to you after a while."

Bob Davies has a knack for bringing smiles to people's faces. In fact, when he steps on stage, the room lights up.

"If the audience is happy, I'm happy," he says.

Although extremely versatile, Bob's noted for his renditions of "The Golden Oldies." His impersonations of Elvis Presley and Buddy Holly are unique. He also loves old-fashioned gospel songs and saves the best of these for visits to area nursing homes where residents hang on every word.

But singing's no longer a full-time profession for Bob. Instead, he's a salesman on the staff of Conlin Motors Ltd., in Markham.

He became associated with the automobile business through good friends, Jim Keyin and Richard Bartley, and Berlie Tunney. They suggested he give it a try and he's happy he did.

"At first I didn't know whether to sing a song or sell a car," he says, "now I do both."

In 1986, he received a "Certificate of Appreciation Award." The plaque hangs on his office wall.

Bob speaks in glowing terms of the "people pleasers" at Conlin's particularly Scott Pearl, the firm's general manager.

"He's a super guy," says Bob, "he lets me be myself."

However, singing to the accompaniment of his 30-year-old guitar is Bob Davies' real self, his first love. "Whenever I get the urge," he concludes.
