



Steelcase wins lighting award

Steelcase Canada Ltd. has won an award for its showroom lighting from the Illuminating Engineering Society.

The IES, a self-governing body that develops and monitors lighting standards to North America, bestowed only 84 of the Edwin F. Guth Awards of Merit to companies around the world this year.

A framed certificate was presented to Steelcase President Peter Wege II by Joe Scott, Lighting Designer for H.H. Angus Ltd., the firm that designed and installed the system.

Scott said each installation submitted for an award is judged on its complexity, aesthetic appearance, and whether or not the desired result was achieved.

"With Steelcase, the main consideration was to try to add to the textures and colors of the furniture," Scott said. "Being a showroom, it was important to ensure the furniture would be shown to its best advantage, while at the same time creating a sense of drama."

The lighting highlight of the showroom is a material sample room. The room was provided with three separate systems — cool white fluorescent, warm white fluorescent, and incandescent — each being independently controlled. Since color shades vary depending upon the type of lighting, clients can select materials in an environment with the same type of light as the area where the materials will be installed.

Scott added that there were interesting challenges posed by the unique ceiling in the showroom. The design firm of Rice-Brydone had specified a multi-levelled ceiling, in which all of the lighting would be recessed.

"We worked closely with them, and while the job wasn't easy the end result was an award-winning design," said Scott.

The town is now served by the newest Drake Office Overload location at 27 Wellington Street W. and Branch Manager Pat Humfries is looking forward to the challenge.

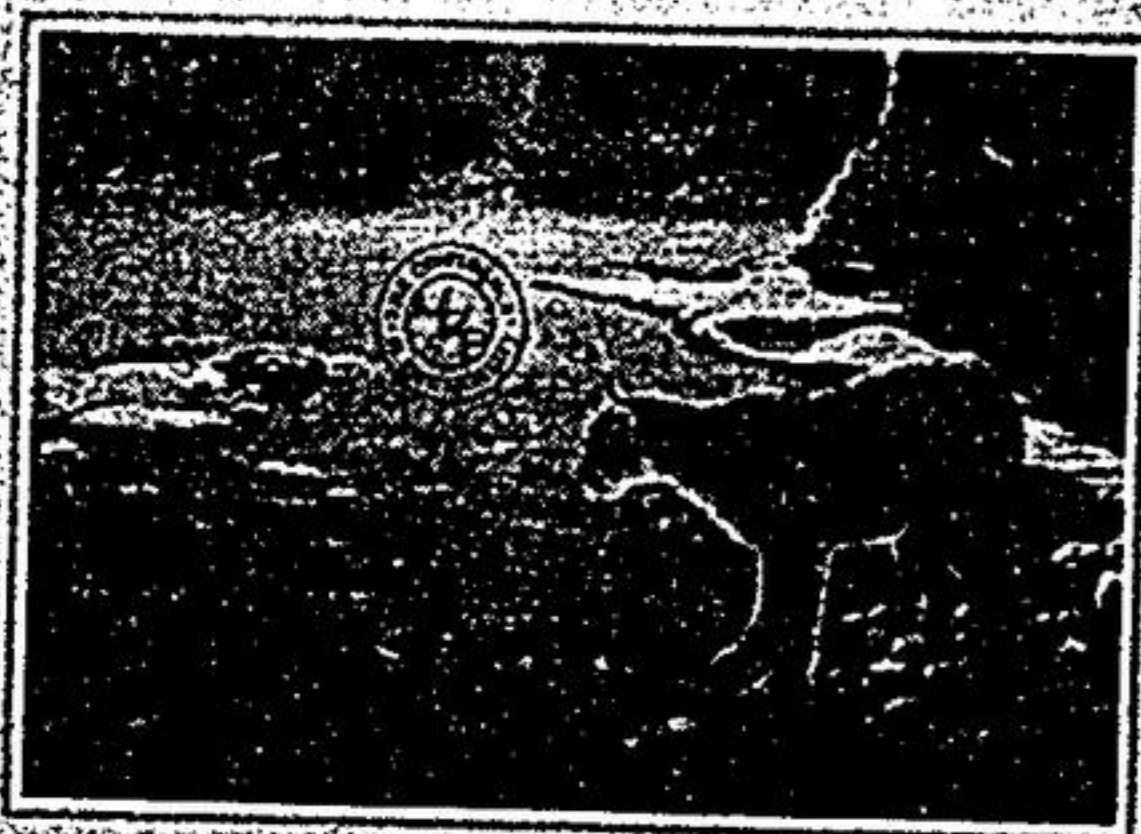

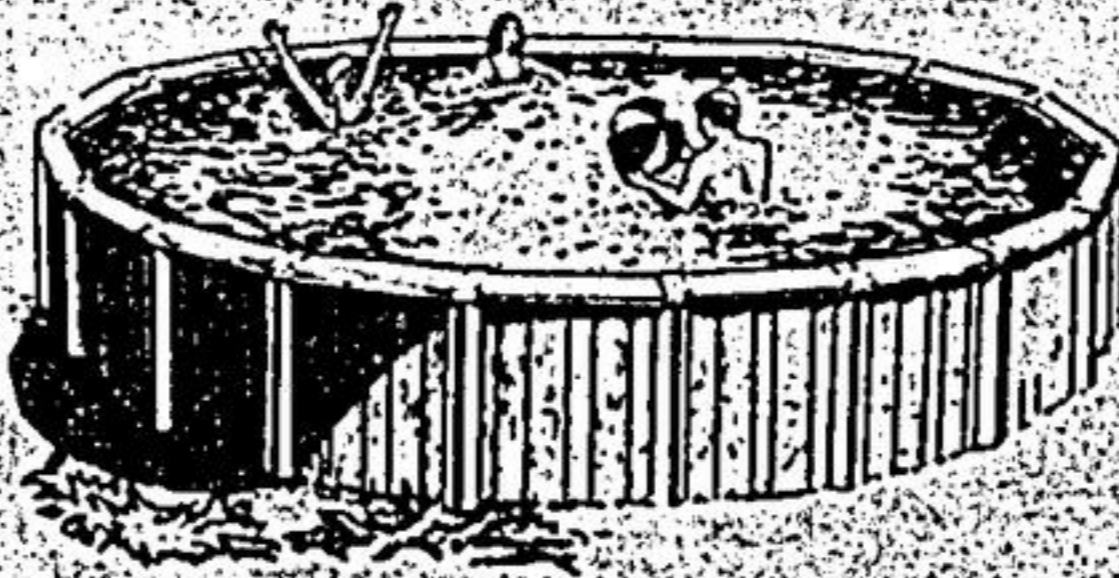
