

Lily Judd was talented lady

On March 12, the death occurred in Clearwater, Florida, of Mrs. Lily Judd. She was 85. Mrs. Judd will be greatly missed by her husband, her family of five children, her nine grandchildren and five great-grandchildren. Mrs. Judd, the former Lily May Alsop, was born July 19, 1901, daughter of Joseph and Alice Alsop of Goodwood. Mr. and Mrs. Judd made their home at Baysville, Lake of Bays for ten years, where Frank Judd was employed by Ontario Hydro.

In 1943, Mr. Judd was transferred to the Orillia area office. The family then resided near Atherley. On his retirement from Hydro in 1970, Mr. and Mrs. Judd made their home at Gray's Bay on the east shore of Lake Couchiching. They lived their during the spring and summer, then in the area of Clearwater, Florida during fall and winter. Mrs. Judd, assisted by two neighbors, was instrumental in organizing the Atherley Women's Institute. She was the first in-

terim president and later elected president for two successive terms. Mrs. Judd was keenly interested in oil painting. She received instruction from several noted artists and attended night art classes at the Orillia District Collegiate Vocational Institute. Many of her paintings were featured at local shows. At least 65 are prominently displayed across Canada and the United States. Mrs. Judd was a member of the Orillia Horticultural Society and the Orillia Camera Club. Other in-

terests included crocheting, bar-jello, crewel and ceramics. Their residences at Baysville, Atherley and Gray's Bay were beautifully landscaped with flowerbeds of her personal design. Service from the Mundell Funeral Home, Orillia, March 18, was conducted by Rev. Thomas Delaney with spring interment St. James' Cemetery, Orillia. Pallbearers were four grandsons — Brian and Richard Chenard; Paul South; George South Jr.; and two family friends, David Fenton and Cecil Byers.

Stouffville Missionary Church

New addition a proud project

By DENISE McDONALD STOUFFVILLE — After six months of construction, Stouffville's Missionary Church will officially open its new 7,000 square foot addition at a dedication ceremony May 31, 3 p.m. According to Rev. Jim Clubine, construction workers have been on site since the last week in September, 1986, when they demolished the original 1903 structure located on the west side of the church facilities. "All present construction is on the site of the original building," says Rev. Clubine. "Although two additions were added to the 1903 structure during the 50s and 60s, we had everything torn down except the church facilities we presently occupy which were built in 1968."

"Because we tore down the building, we've had to use some of the facilities at Summitview and Orchard Park Public School's in order to get by until we can get into the new addition," says Rev. Clubine. Although construction has not seriously interfered with Church activities, Rev. Clubine admits to looking forward to moving into the new building. "We're just a little bit behind in completing the addition," he says. "It was originally supposed to be finished by the middle or end of March, but it shouldn't be too much longer now."

Included in the new structure will be additional classroom facilities, with increased space for toddlers and a nursery, along with two new washrooms, kitchen, library and full-size gymnasium. It will also have a wheelchair lift and ramps making the Church fully accessible to all members of the public. Rev. Clubine also claims the building's central hallway was partially blocked off, allowing for extra space in the existing classrooms.
