'Who's needs should church serve?' Unionville pastor asks

The church did not meet our need," was the reason a young couple gave for leaving to 'shop around.' Hearing this, some might immediately jump to the conclusion that the church was at fault and had failed in its ministry. (Incidentally, that's the only exercise some people get — jumping to conclusions).

But, in all fairness, can we so conclude? Perhaps, the church did fail, but before such a judgement can be made we need to ask this qualifying question, "Was the need not met a need the church should have met?" In other words, should a local church try to meet everybody's expressed needs? Seemingly, a lot of people have this idea regarding the responsibility of a church. This 'supermarket' concept reasons that unless a church stocks everybody's special brand of activity or interest, then the church is deficient and it's time to 'shop around.'

Perhaps this is their democratic prerogative, but is this 'supermarket' concept valid? I suggest not for the following reasons:

- Experience sadly teaches that needs sometimes turn out to be nothing more than whims, fads and, or, love of novelty. If a church tries to cater to this, it will find itself competing with Hollywood and the entertainment world. This will prove futile in the extreme since the

world will always 'knock spots' off us when it comes to entertainment.

- "One man's meat is another man's poison." This is true even with Christians. One day it will be different, but whilst we are in the "body of humiliation" and know the conflict of the two natures, it is unrealistic to think we can please everyone. Indeed, to try is to please nobody.

- While the church is closely identified and related to the Kingdom of God, there is a distinction between the two. The church should not be expected to shoulder the responsibilities assigned to the individual, the family and the State.

- The supreme and primary objective of the church is the glory of God. Scripture states this repeatedly, (e.g. Eph. 3:21). Certainly, churches have the responsibility to minister to the needs of people, but that ministry is to be governed by Scripture. After all, whose church is it? Who is the head of the church? (see Eph. 1:22-23, 4:15 and 5:23). Scripture then, not people, should dictate the program and ministries of the

church as it reaches out to meet the needs of people.

Here, it seems to me we get to the very crux of the crisis we are facing today in evangelical circles. A subtle form of humanism has infiltrated our ranks. In so many ways our perspective is man-centered and experience-based.

We have been brainwashed into thinking that God's function is to serve man and subsequently we have reduced true Christianity into a scheme of things in which, "God becomes the Aladdin lamp who does the bidding of everyone who will accept His Son and sign a card." As the late A.W. Tozer wrote, "Peace of mind, happiness, prosperity, social acceptance, publicity, success in sports, business, the entertainment field, and perchance to occasionally sit at the same banquet table with a

celebrity — all this on earth and heaven at last. Certainly no insurance company can offer half as much."

Scripture says that "By their faith you will know them" (Mat. 7:20). Fruit takes time to develop but it's the only true test. The fruit of this quasi-Christianity that we are currently seeing harvested on national T.V. speaks for itself.

What then is the purpose of a church that is God centered and scripturally based? A survey of the Scripture would seem to confirm the following features as basic:

- Biblical preaching
- Scriptural church government
- The ordinances of baptism and the Lord's Supper
- Spiritual life evidenced by (a) Worship (b) Holiness of life (c) Brotherly love (d) Evangelism and good works.
