Blues bring junior baseball to town

For the second summer in a row there will be junior baseball action in town courtesy of the Stouffville Blues.

The team, sponsored by Neate-Roller Ltd., will play in the Eastern Ontario Baseball Association (E.O.B.A.) at the junior level.

They begin their season this weekend with a three game homestand at Memorial Park. And we're talking baseball here as in hardball, just like the Blue Jays, and among other things that means double-headers.

The Blues host Whitby-Brooklin at 7:30 p.m. Friday, May 22, take on the Bowmanville Orioles the same time Saturday, and on Sunday afternoon they play a double-header against Newmarket beginning at 1:30 p.m. in Memorial Park.

Blues manager Bill Bower predicts some entertaining baseball will be played at the park this season.

"It's a competitive league, but

we're looking pretty good," he explained. "I'm quite optimistic of our chances."

This is only the second season in existence for the Blues. They played in the York-Simcoe league last year.

Bower said the formation of the team last season came about because of a strong desire among a number of junior aged boys in the town to play baseball. Junior players are under 21 years old.

"Most of these boys are local kids who've played softball in town over the years, and they wanted a team formed so they could play hardball," he said.

Bower admits that some of the squads in the E.O.B.A. are extremely strong, and its asking a lot of a team in its sophomore year to be competitive against long established clubs, but the Blues are building for the future.

"We're going with a few midget and juvenile aged boys this season, and we're hoping to build a

strong team over the next couple of seasons," he said.

However, the team isn't going only with youth. They have a number of veterans returning for another year of baseball. Among them are Nick Ellis, Jeff Bower, Danny Roller, John Parsells, Dave Wilson, George Collins, Paul Henderson and Morgan Winn.

Some of the highly touted rookies this season include Jamie Showers, a star defenceman with the Stouffville Bantam Clippers hockey team, and Tom Letkeman.

The team has been working hard in preparation for the opener, and Bower said the defence is looking especially strong.

The defence is coming along very well," he explained. "It was good last year and its getting better. The hitting is also improving with practice, and the guys who hit well last season don't seem to have lost the touch."

The Blues will play a 26 game league schedule against such

opponents as Newmarket, Little Britain, Aurora, Whitby, Peterborough, Belleville, Port Hope and Bowmanville.
