

Museum readies for special summer events

Pickering Museum Village kicks off its 1987 special events schedule with a Steam-up and opening on Sunday, May 31.

The day's festivities include demonstrations by the Incorporated Militia of Upper Canada to commemorate the Rebellion of 1837. There'll also be a steam-up of vintage engines, which will operate historic farm and lumber machines.

Other upcoming museum activities are Pioneer Horse Day on July 26, and History-In-Action on the Sept. 12-13 weekend.

The Greenwood facility, located on Hwy. 7 three kilometres east of Brock Rd., is open to the public July and August from Wednesday to Sunday from 11 a.m. to 5 p.m. During the months of June and September, it operates on weekends and holidays only.

Admission rates are adults, \$2; senior citizens and students, \$1.25; children 5 to 12, 75 cents;

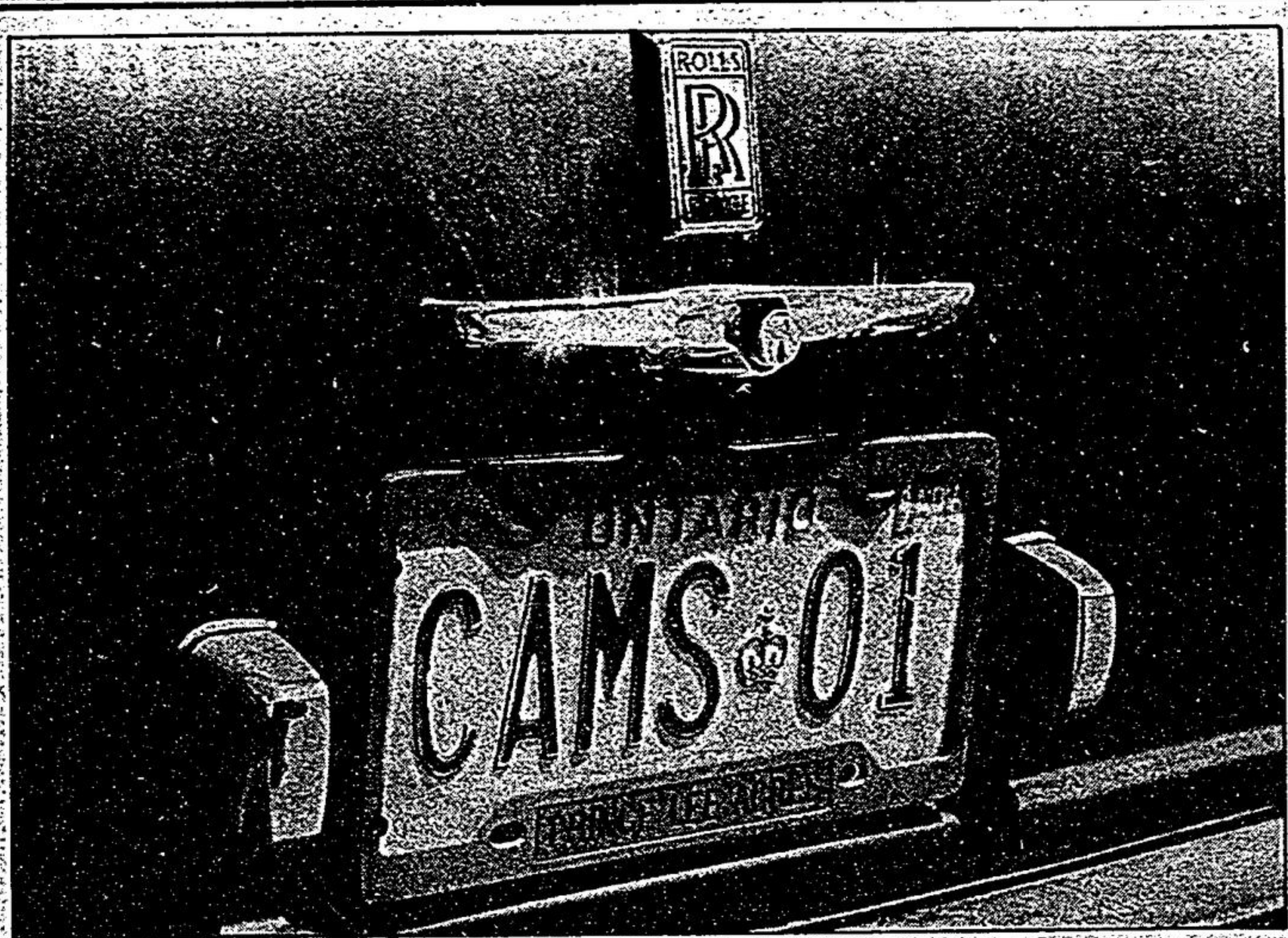
pre-schoolers free; families (two adults and children under 18), \$5. Group rates and annual memberships are available.

New fishing club open near Zephyr

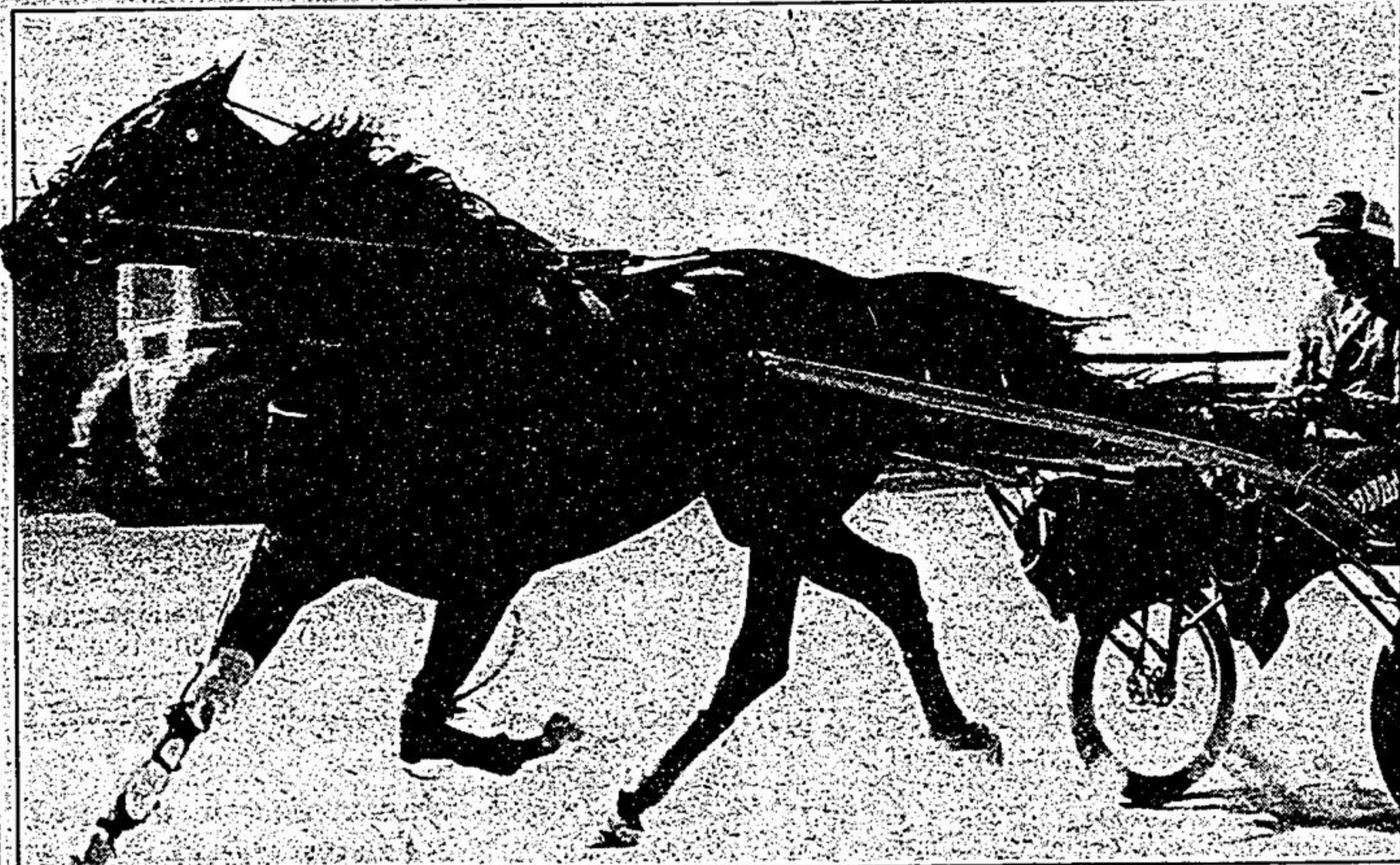
Joseph's Lake, a private Uxbridge Township fishing club set on 33 acres north of Zephyr, recently opened for its inaugural season.

It was officially dedicated last spring as the only lake in Canada to be named after a living person, its long-time owner Joseph Tripolszky.

The club has stocked the man-made body of water with 12-inch rainbow trout, and offers trout fishing on an annual membership or day-to-day basis.

A yearly charge of \$300 per family includes spouse and children under 18 with a free catch of 50 fish. Day permits are \$10 per rod and 35 cents per inch for all fish caught.

The spring-fed lake has facilities such as rental boats and refreshments in a summer house complete with fireplace and BBQs.

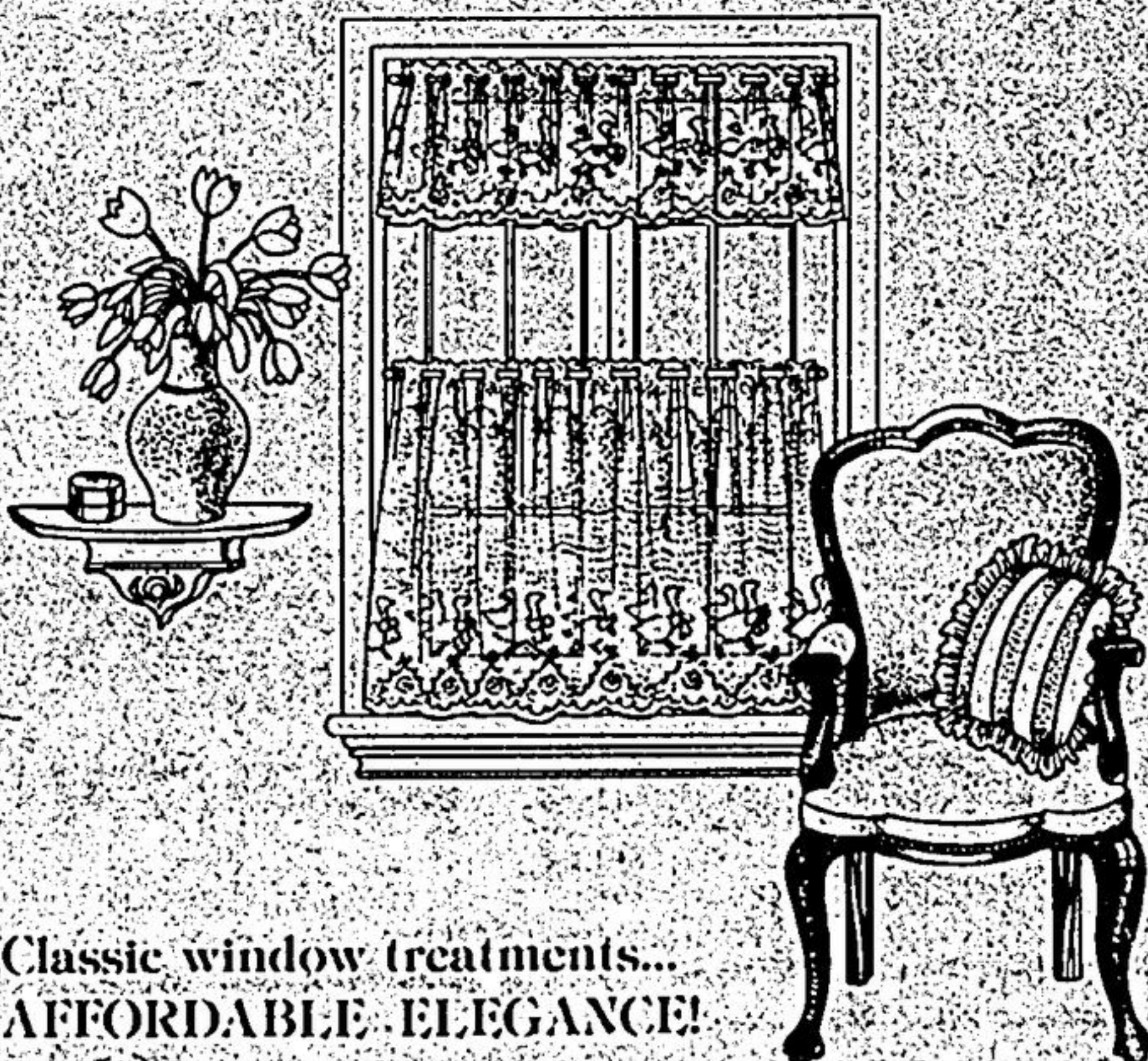
