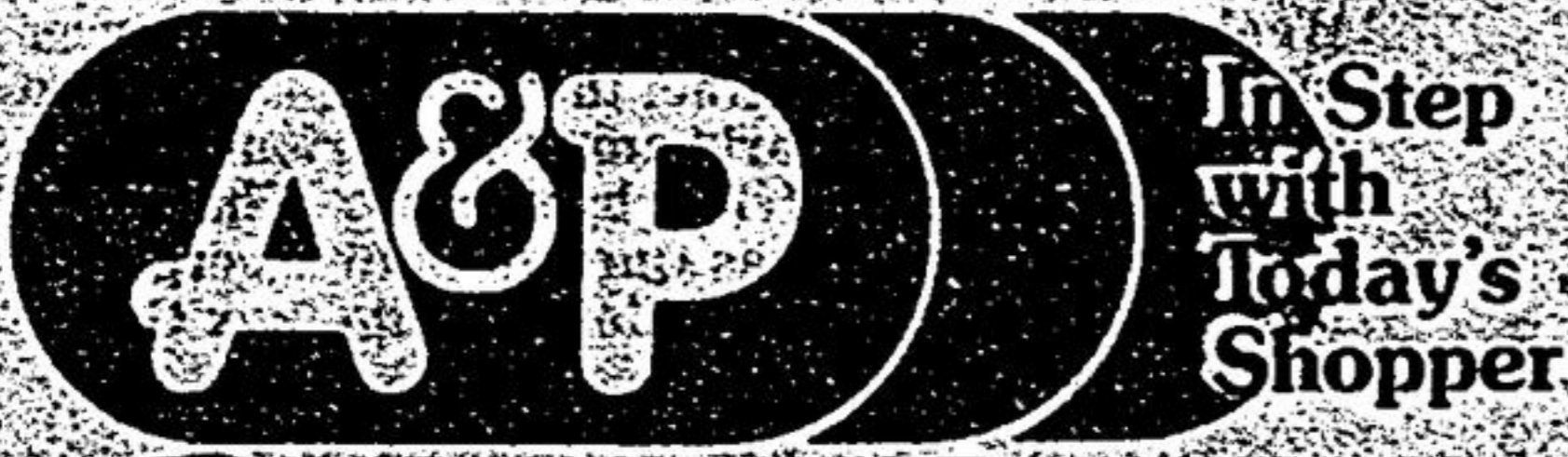

Eagle lands in Stouffville

Hockey super-lawyer Alan Eagleson soared into Stouffville Wednesday even though he'd hoped to be in Edmonton watching the Stanley Cup finals.

The Eagle was the high-profile guest speaker at a fund-raising dinner for Ross Stevenson, Progressive Conservative MPP for the Durham York riding that'll be joined by Whitchurch-Stouffville when boundary changes come into effect in the next provincial election.

"Here I am in Stouffville when I could be in Edmonton, but it's not so bad being here in Stouffville to share an evening with two good friends — (Sarnia MPP) Andy Brandt, your master of ceremonies; Ross Stevenson, your guest of honor," Mr. Eagleson told the gathering at Spring Lakes Golf Club.

The high-profile Tory pledged his continuing support for PC leader Larry Grossman, saying "things are not easy (right now) but you find out who your friends are when things are tough."

Mr. Eagleson then vacated the political arena to speak about his exploits organizing the country's international hockey showdowns, including the epic 1972 battle between Canada and the Soviets.

"For people of my generation and 10 years on either side, '72 will be as clear in our lifetimes as anything else in memory," he claimed.

Mr. Stevenson arrived near the end of a pre-dinner reception, carrying a plastic grocery bag full of the 1987 Ontario budget, released by the Provincial Liberal government that day.

When it was finally his turn

to take the floor, the Uxbridge-area politician wasted no time in lashing out at Premier David Peterson in particular and the budget in general.

"Now I ask you to stand back and think 'who is putting that money into the government coffers?' And I ask you to stand back and just look past our pretty premier and think where we're going in this province," Mr. Stevenson said, noting that the Liberal budget is up to \$35 billion from \$20 billion when he was first elected in 1981.

"And reflect to think if even Pierre Trudeau could have matched that, and I can tell you that he couldn't and he didn't."

He added: "We are now seeing in Ontario the biggest bloating of government spending ever seen in this province."
