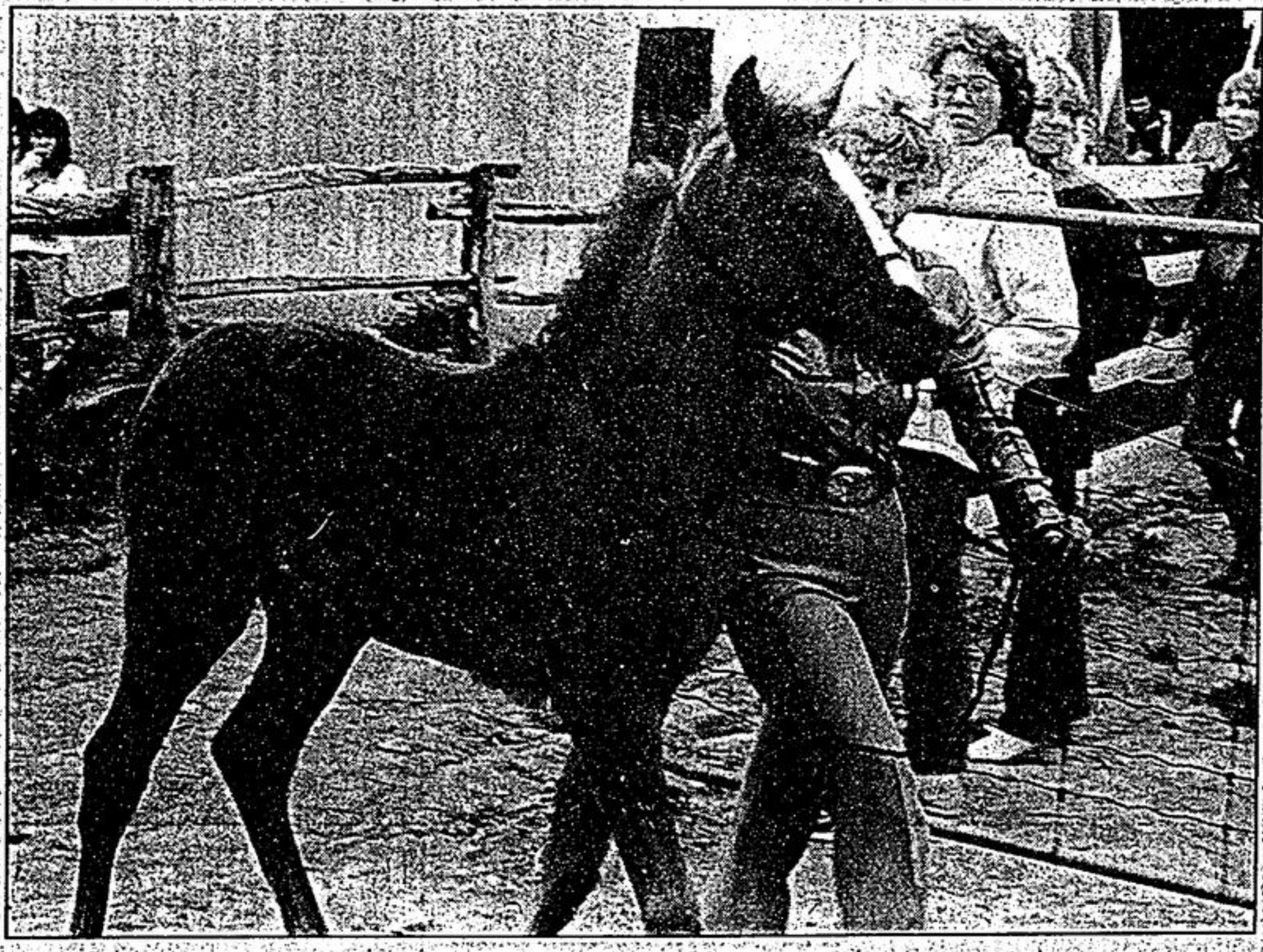


## Arabians on show

Results of the game between Magna Concord and Green's Restaurant were unavailable.


