Sculpture in progress at gallery

The Latham Gallery's newest exhibit, *Sculpture in Progress/Progress*, features the stages of creating a sculpture from beginning to end. Sculptor Marilyn Campbell of Unionville is working outside the Whitchurch-Stouffville Public Library, 65 Main St. West, for approximately five weeks during the months of May and June.

Gallery director Irene Emig said she hopes the project, which began Monday, will encourage questions and dialogue about this artist and others featured there.

"People generally find it easier to ask questions of someone at work in a casual setting rather than in a more formal one such as a gallery," she said.

Ms. Campbell will be working with cement, first making a metal armature on which she will apply the cement. The subject of the piece

is to be a seated female figure.

Any relevant drawings to the piece will be displayed. Mrs. Emig said this will demonstrate how the finished work reflects the artist's original intentions and the public's expectations.

She said by showing the entire process of a sculpture's creation, people may see what problems arise, and how the artist will handle them.

Ms. Campbell has worked for 10 years in sculpture of sand, wood, welded metal and cement. She has had several exhibitions in the Toronto area, and most recently has exhibited welded and wood sculpture for The Latham Gallery.

She'll be working daily from approximately 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. The project is funded by a special project grant from the Ontario Arts Council.
