Carole says she's received tremendous support from everyone, including her husband, the staff and students. She describes Principal Peter Bright as "a caring, understanding, sensitive person."

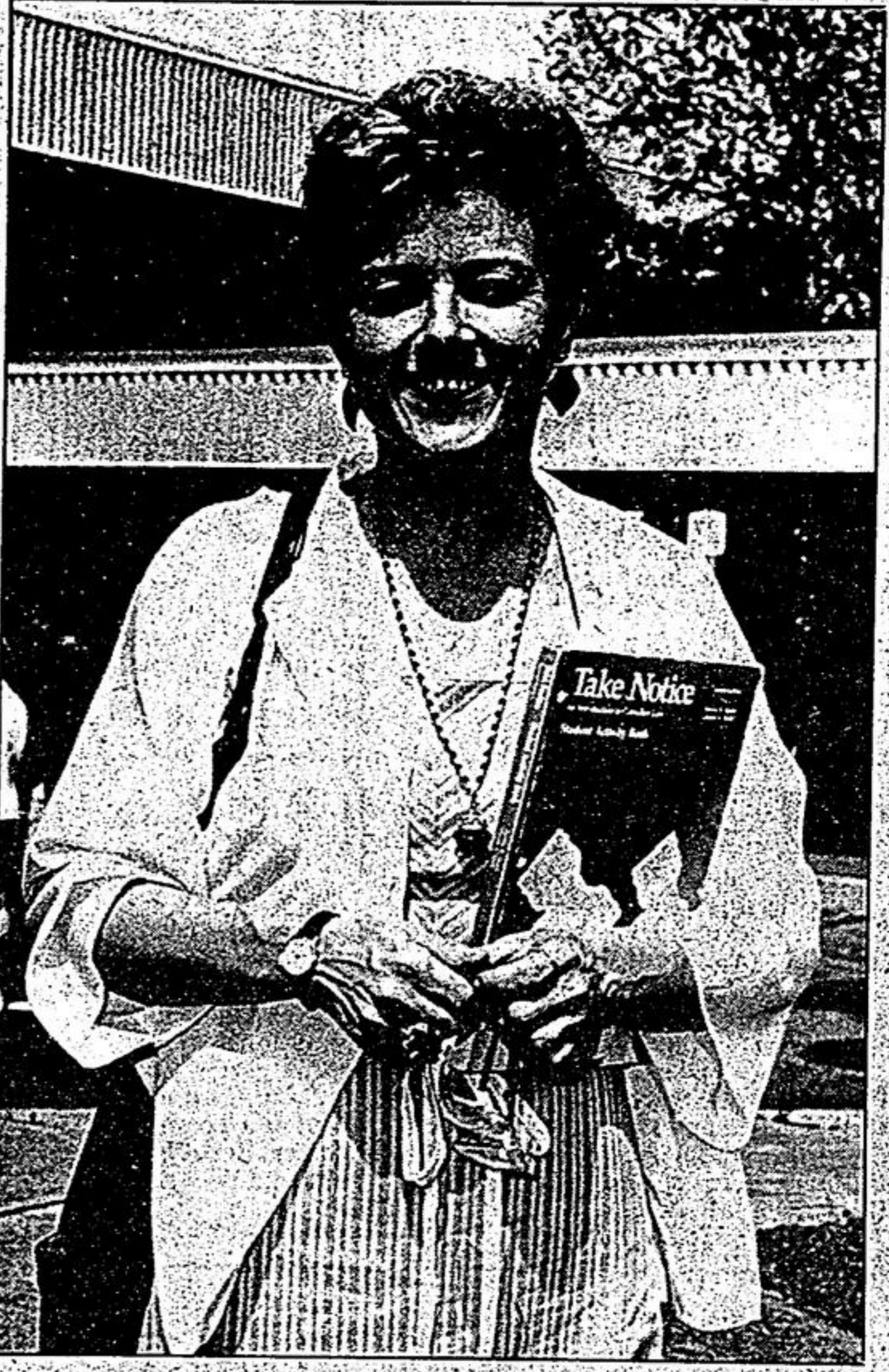
The biggest adjustment, Mrs. Pilote says, "was teaching myself how to study." Accounting was her favorite subject with Chemistry and English close seconds.

Carole considers it a privilege to have enjoyed a close association with staff and students at S.D.S.S. over the past nine months.

"I'm following a dream," she concludes. "I can't fail now; I've come too far."

Cooking Tips

1 lb. scallops, salt, 1/4 cup flour, 1 egg beaten, 3/4 cup bread crumbs. Separate scallops and sprinkle with salt. Roll scallops in flour, dip in egg, roll in bread crumbs. Melt in fry pan butter, 2 tbs. oil, touch of garlic. Place scallops in fry pan, golden brown on one side, flip over. Do not overcook. Serve as is or with a tartar sauce. Bon Appetit — Penny.


