STOUFFVILLE—Fifteen people attending a meeting in Latham Gallery of the Public Library, May 27, firmly believe an Historical Society is needed in Whitchurch-Stouffville. It was agreed discussions should be held on a monthly basis, at various locations throughout the municipality. A tentative date of Sept. 23 has been set with Ruth Burkholder, Jim West, Wayne Lambert, Bill Mowat and Gladys Clarkson to arrange the program. Mrs. Burkholder explained how the present Historical Group had originated. She said it all came about through a telephone conversation between herself and Councillor Jim Sanders. As a result, a meeting was held at Councillor Sanders' home. Others attending included Bryan Millip and Vic Sanders. A month later, this group was joined by Mayor Fran Sainsbury, Chief Librarian George Schlukbier and Town historian Jean Barkey. In April, a 'steering committee' was established with the additions of Marion Murphy and Jim West. This led to the public meeting, Wednesday. Guest speaker was Heather Broadbent, Heritage Resource Officer for the Town of Caledon. The audience was treated to a set of slides depicting historic buildings in the former Village of Stouffville and the Twp. of Whitchurch, shown by Jean Barkey. "The evening was a most enjoyable one," said Mrs. Burkholder, "hopefully the beginning of a historical group in Whitchurch-Stouffville."

**TOWN OF WHITCHURCH-STOUFFVILLE NOTICE TO PROPERTY OWNERS TO DESTROY WEEDS**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN to all persons in possession of land in accordance with the Weed Control Act, Ontario, that unless the noxious weeds or weed seeds growing on their lands within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville are destroyed by June 15th, 1987, and throughout the season as often as it is necessary to prevent the ripening of their seeds and dispersal of their pollens, the Council of the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville has appointed a Weed Inspector to cause said weeds or weed seeds to be destroyed in such manner as he may deem proper, and that the expenses incurred by the said Weed Inspector in the discharge of his duties shall be placed on the Collector's Roll of the Municipality against the respective lands concerned and that such amounts shall be collected in the same manner as taxes.

Although Dandelions, Burdock and Goldenrod are not considered noxious weeds within the Town of Whitchurch-Stouffville under the Weed Control Act, the co-operation of all citizens is solicited in the elimination of these nuisance weeds.

The co-operation of all persons concerned is earnestly solicited.
