

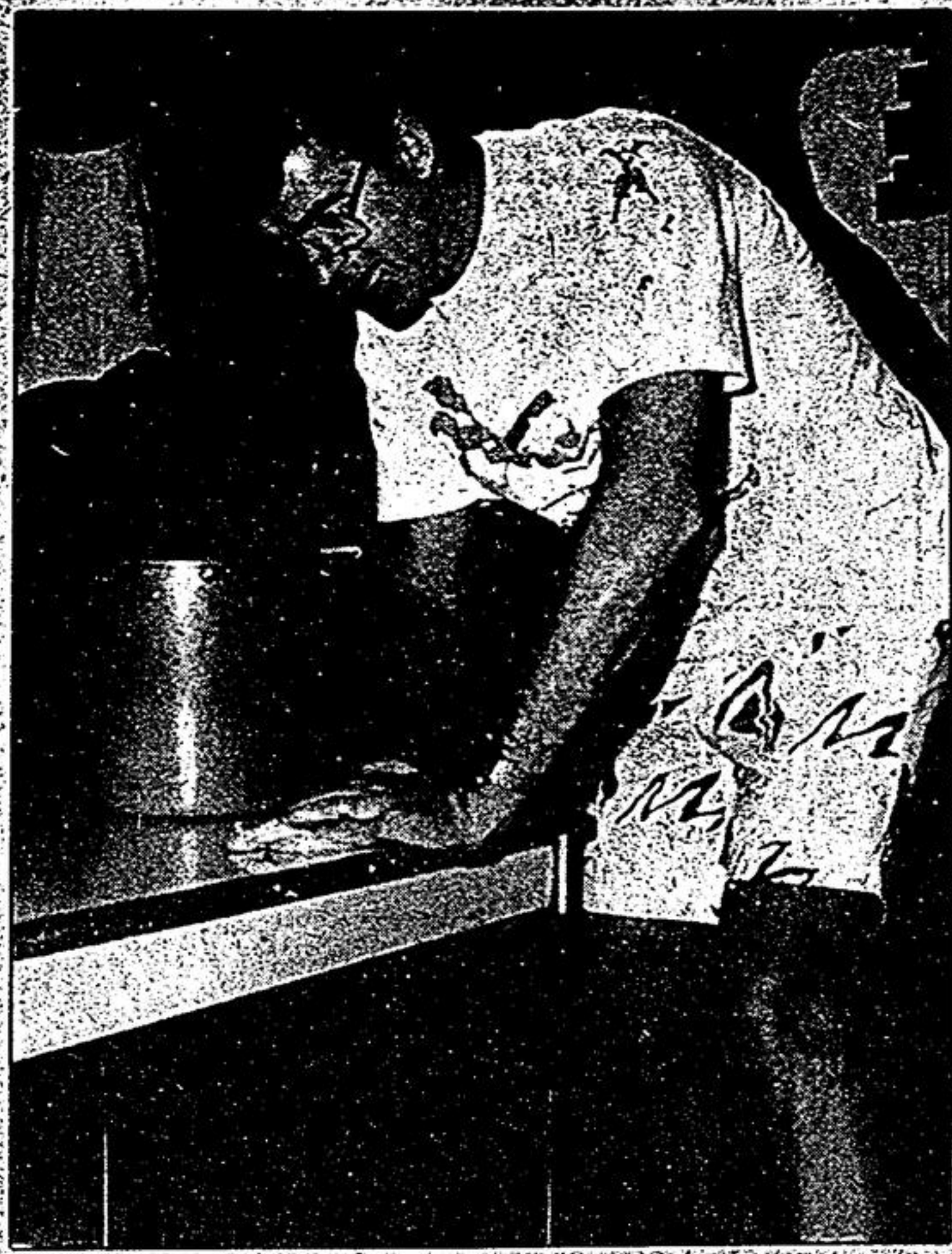
S.D.S.S. teacher 'slave auction' raises money for a good cause

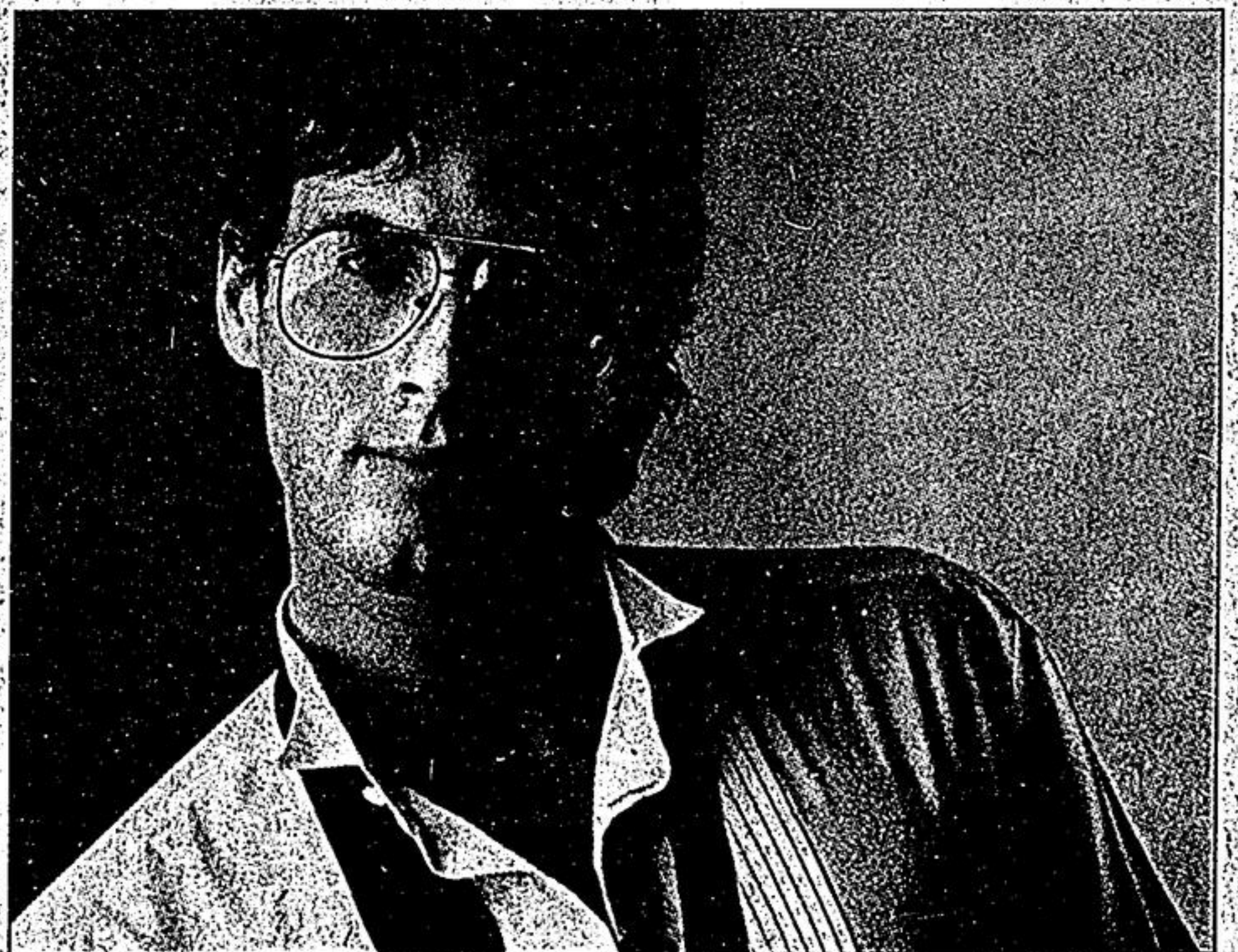
