According to York Regional Police, the driver of a late-model Chev escaped injury when his southbound car collided with an eastbound Suzuki jeep at about 4:35 p.m. The driver of the jeep, Stan Rodger, 26, and passenger Bruce Paul, 34, were not seriously hurt while another passenger, Doug Greig, 35, suffered a broken knee. Liberal chief explains meeting mix-up

Dear Editor: Although I have not yet seen the article, I understand that substantial prominence was given in your weekend edition (June 6) of allegations of theft from Uxbridge Secondary School on the occasion of the Liberal nomination meeting held on May 29. As the permit application to the Durham Board of Education in connection with this meeting called for the use of the school's public address system, I assumed that it would be in place when we arrived for the meeting. Unfortunately, I did not realize that where the public address system is to be used it is also necessary to make separate application to the school in question (in addition to the application to the Board offices

for the premises permit) in order to arrange for the public address system to be set up and operated. Had I read the permit carefully when it reached me I would have become aware of this. Unfortunately I did not.

When I found on May 29 that we had a crowd of more than 1,000 people and no public address system had been set up, nor any lecturer for holding notes, I asked one of the members of the executive to find the custodian in order to have the public address system set up.

When, on my return to the auditorium, I found the public address system was set up I assumed that the custodian had attended to this.

On the following Monday morning I received a call from the school, advising me that someone had pried the lock of a cupboard and taken out the public address system without appropriate arrangements with the school. I was also advised that a spare microphone which had been in the cupboard was missing.

I told the vice-principal that I would make enquires but in the meantime he could be assured that whatever had happened, and no matter who had done the things he was bringing to my attention, he could be assured that the Durham-York Liberal Association accepted full responsibility and would make good any loss or damage.

Subsequent enquiries revealed that someone, whose identity I have not yet ascertained, did in fact pry open the cupboard, removed the public address system and set it up. While I can appreciate that, in the heat of the moment with a large crowd waiting for a meeting to start, someone might be induced to take such liberties with the school's property, this should not have happened.

I have extended on behalf of the Association this Association's apologies to the school for this incident.

I have not succeeded in obtaining any information about the missing microphone. I have however been advised by school authorities of the replacement cost and have arranged to deliver to the school a cheque to pay for it.

I have also assured the vice-principal that as soon as he advises me of the cost of making good all damage to the cupboard this Association will pay for the damage.
