**Public complains about tennis times**

Whitchurch-Stouffville's recreation and cultural services committee will consider drawing up a shared-use agreement with local tennis clubs after a number of residents complained of a lack of public playing time.

She claimed the main principle surrounding tennis clubs is to provide a program for youths and adults alike, with minimum maintenance and no capital expenditures.

According to recreation manager Marlane McKee-Wetheral, residents have called wanting to know the Town's policy governing tennis clubs and what authority they have over time for club and public use.

"We don't have any closed clubs in the area and we're not shutting the door on people wishing to join," said Ward 5 Councillor Wilf Morley. "I myself think these people are providing a very good service to the town."

"Most of the prime time is taken up by the clubs," Mrs. McKee-Wetheral said at a meeting Tuesday. "I don't think we can arbitrarily change that right away. However, my own personal

Councillor Wayne Emmerson of Ward 4 added: "The only time I think is a real problem is on a Saturday. If the clubs were to give more public time on this day I don't think there would be as big a one."
