

Strawberry Festival events interest young and old alike



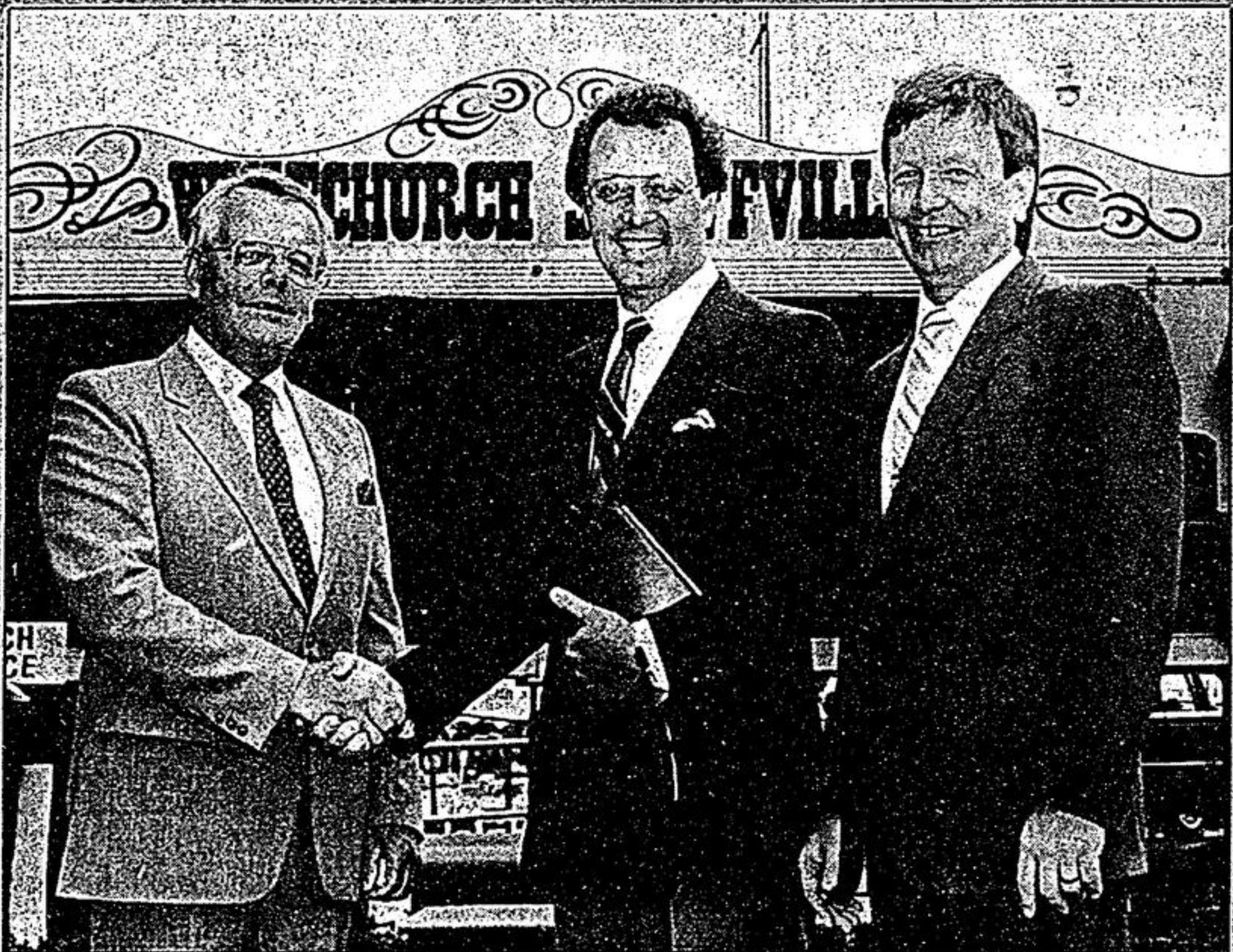

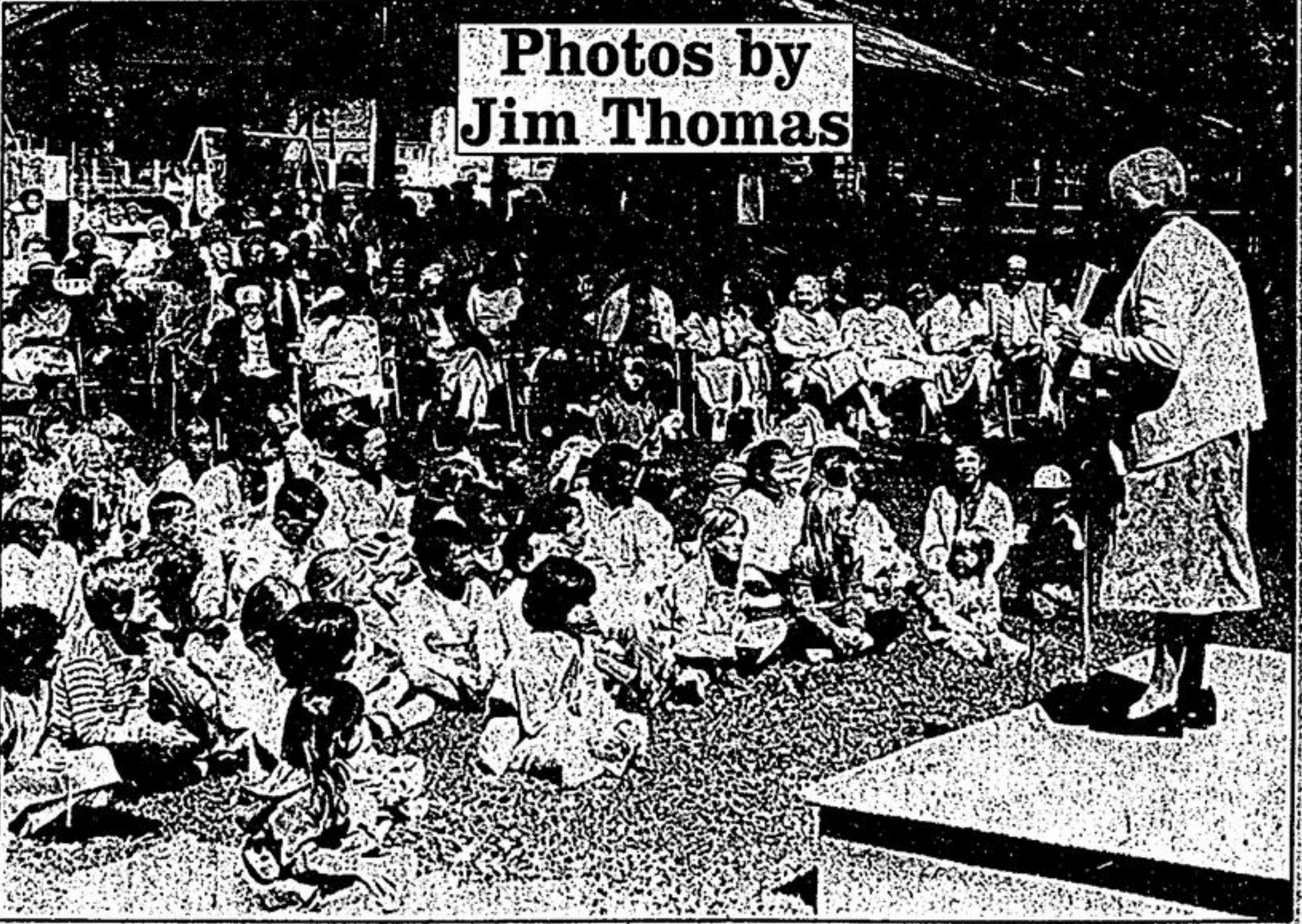
