Golf driving range approved

STOUFFVILLE — Town Council has conditionally approved the use of land on Ninth Line North for a miniature golf course and driving range.

Council voted in favor of a proposal made by Ashmore Reesor to redesignate property south of Bethesda Road on the west side of the Ninth Line to Recreation Commercial. The site is now zoned

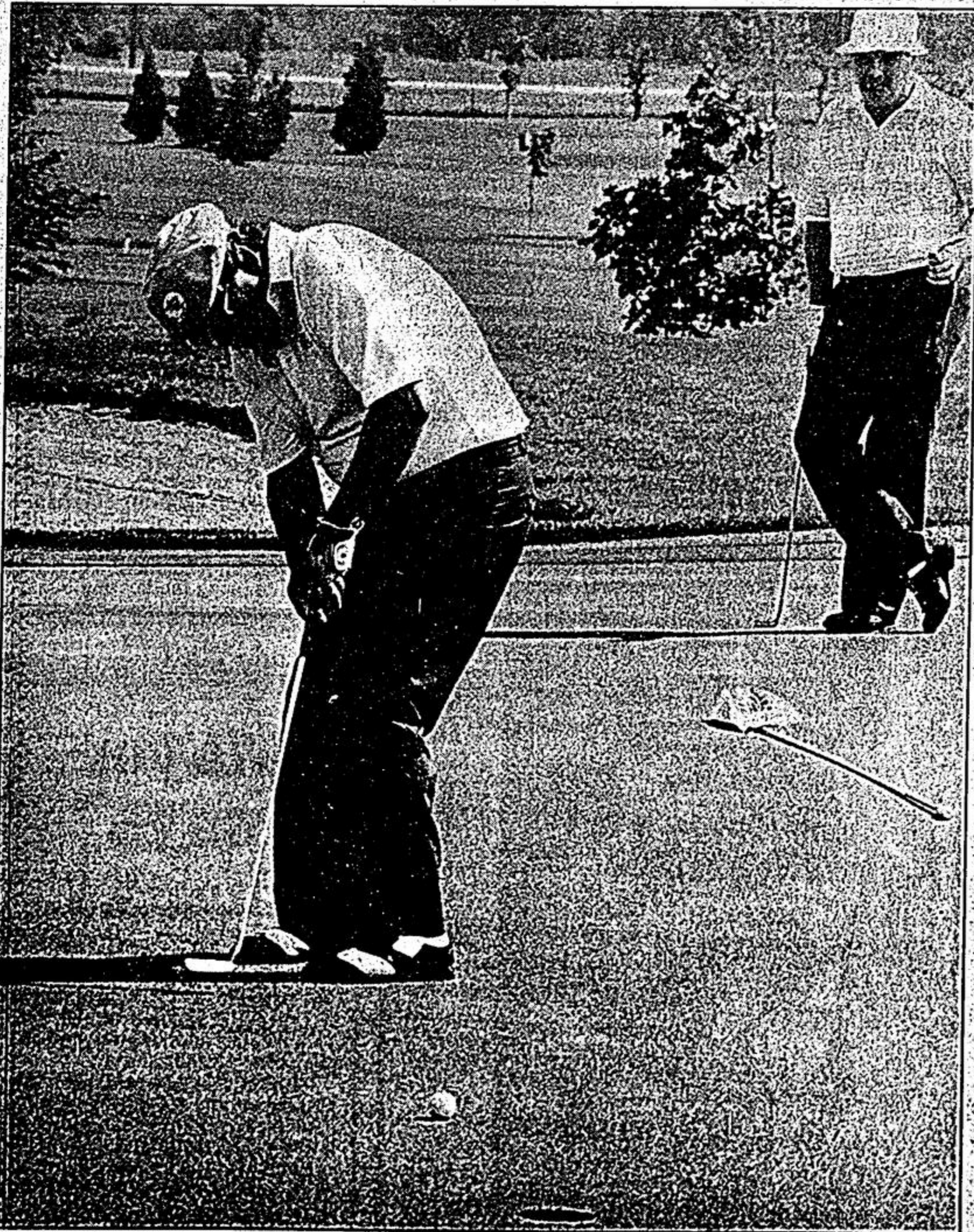
Rural. Approval was given on the conditions that Mr. Reesor provide the following: (1). Necessity of the proposed use; (2). Potential traffic generated and its effect on existing road conditions and traffic patterns; (3). Physical suitability of the land; (4). A site plan for the project.

Councillor Jim Sanders expressed concern over the zoning

change. "This will detract from the farmland we want in the area," he said.

However, Mayor Fran Sainsbury argued this type of land-use is inevitable at this location.

"I think the days of totally rural land-use (between Hwy. 48 and Ninth Line south of Bethesda Road) are limited," she concluded.
