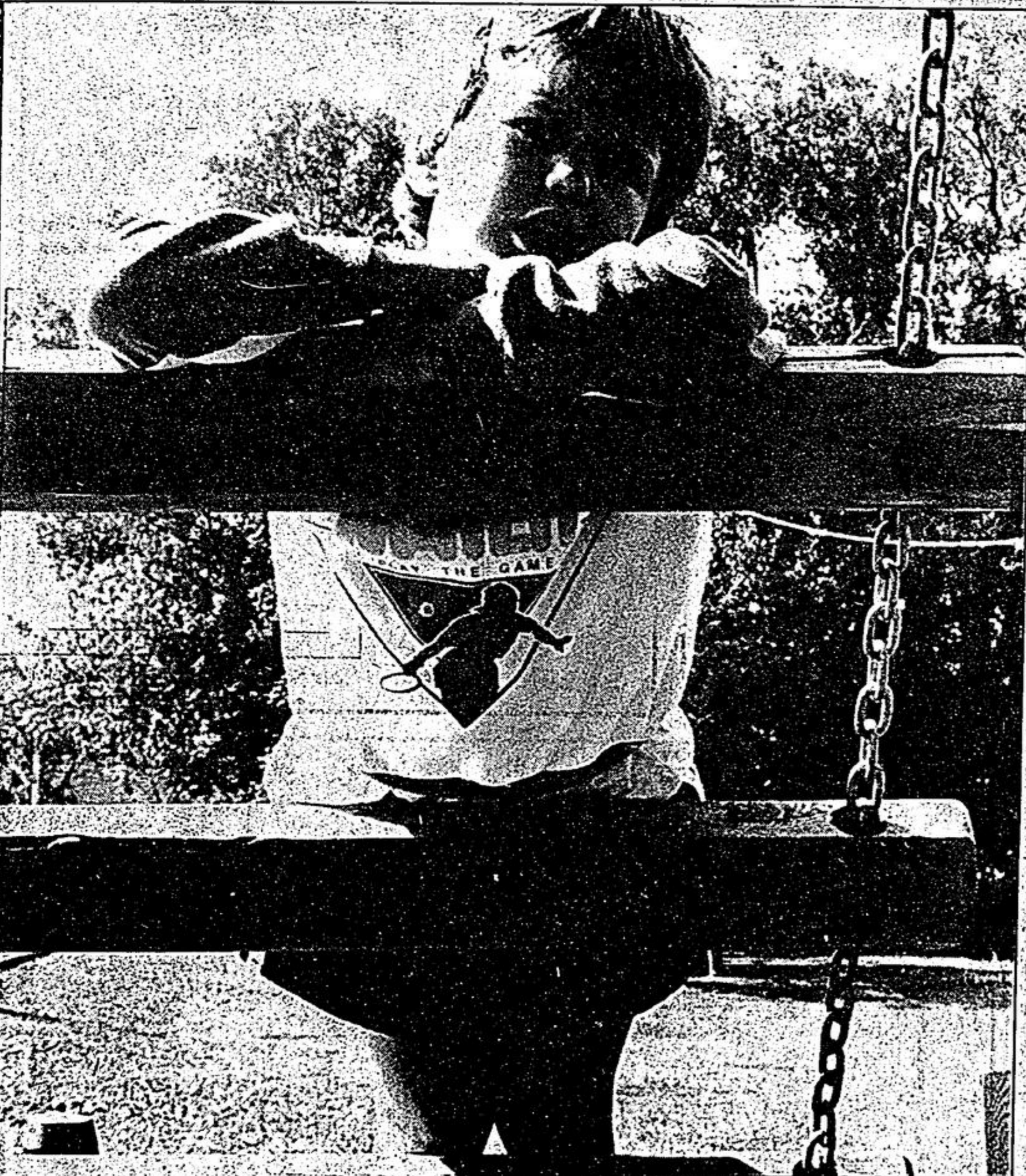


Finding a cure for the summertime blues

A trip to a Blue Jays game and a concert at Ontario Place are among a number of summer trips offered by the Whitchurch-Stouffville Recreation Department for youths over age 13. The Summer Youth Trips

program is presented by the recreation department, and transportation is sponsored by McNeil Pharmaceutical.

Events scheduled include a Blue Jays game against the Boston Red Sox, a concert at Ontario Place and a trip to Sunshine Beach amusement park.

Adult supervisors accompany all trips, and buses leave from and return to the Recreation Centre on Ninth Line North.

The Blue Jay trip is slated for the night of July 29. The bus leaves at 6 p.m., and returns after the game. Cost is \$9, \$6 or \$4 depending on which tickets are available. There are a limited number of seats so

please book early for this trip. A visit to Ontario Place to see the rock opera Dolly DeLuxe at the Forum is planned for Aug. 5. Cost is \$5 and the bus leaves at 6 p.m. for the 8:30 p.m. performance. Participants will return home at about 10:30 p.m.

Also, on Aug. 26 a trip to Sunshine Beach and Water Park is slated. This amusement park features rides, slides and a wave pool. Participant should bring lunch money. Cost is \$7.95, and the bus leaves at 9:30 a.m. and should return at 4 p.m.
