The Town of Markham is the opening act at the CNE's Heritage Village Days on Wednesday.

The Heritage Village Program celebrates the history of Ontario communities by providing them with a 'day' to showcase their past, present and future through song, dance and display.

Markham co-ordinator Carole Harbaruk said the support she has received from the community has been overwhelming.

"The magnitude of the job has amazed me," she said. "I must have made 1,000 phone calls, but the support has been there."

Markham Day highlights include opening ceremonies performed by Mayor Carole Bell, who will also be the grand marshal in the CNE parade of the day.

Resident Town Crier John Webster will be the MC, and Bob Hall from Markham Parks and Recreation will keep the kids happy with his clownish talents. Free face painting will also be available.

Ten booths will be set up around a middle seating area displaying Markham's history.

Videos and pictures depicting the past will be provided by the Town of Markham, the Unionville Historical Society and the Markham Museum, among others.

Local visual artists will be showcasing their talents; the Markham Guild of Village Crafts will man a display table, as will the Markham Group of Artists, to name just two.

Mrs. Harbaruk said entertainment will be provided by local artists for eight full hours from noon until 8 p.m.

Performers include singer Diana Nahr, The Heritage Seniors Choir, and the Heritage Center Line Dancers.

"We will be located right at the Dufferin Gates, and we hope the constant entertainment will draw people over to us. I feel it will be very successful, especially if we have good weather. We certainly have the support and participation."
