With one exception. This is the company's franchise headquarters and office location for Marlene Storry, the firm's executive vice-president and general manager.

She sparkles with ambition and enthusiasm. "I'm totally happy with what I'm doing," says the 36-year-old former Bloomington girl. "I love it."

Marlene grew up on a farm in Whitchurch Twp., the daughter of Noel and Jean Storry, now of Hemlock Drive, Stouffville. She has two sisters, Dianne of Unionville and Susan of Cobourg.

Formal education was obtained at Bloomington Public School and Stouffville High. It wasn't long after joining the Country Style staff that Marlene's abilities were recognized. For two years, Marlene served as director and two years as president of the Asso-

ciation of Canadian Franchisors. She's now a member on the Advisory Board of the Bank of Montreal.

Through all this, Marlene hasn't forgotten her roots. She appreciates the closeness of her parents and sisters and their willingness to help whenever help is needed.

For relaxation, she enjoys cross-country and downhill skiing, and swimming.

Holidays have included trips to Acapulco, Hawaii and Florida.

"Being part of the business world isn't easy," Marlene admits. "You need foresight to make changes so you're not left behind."

"Yes, I'd do it all again," Marlene responds. "It's a good feeling when you can get up on a Monday morning and want to go to work."
