Ballantrae principal plans 'team effort'

BALLANTRAE — A team effort. That's Jim Jefferis' goal as principal of Ballantrae Public School.
 Mr. Jefferis is anxious for all members of staff to work as a team. The children, he says, are the beneficiaries of a co-operative system.
 Born at Waubaushie, Ont., Jim attended Midland Dist. High School and Toronto Teachers' College. He received his B.A. degree from Sir Wilfrid Laurier University, Waterloo.
 Mr. Jefferis' first teaching position was at a Protestant Separate School in Penetanguishine. He was made vice-principal at Maple Leaf Public School, East Gwillimbury and held a similar position at Park Avenue Public School, Holland Landing. Principalships have included Schomberg, Mount Albert and Keswick.
 Jim sees the library as an important func-

tion within the school. He's already stressed this through the appointment of a full-time librarian at Ballantrae. He's hopeful students will take full advantage of this service.
 Enrollment at Ballantrae (K to 8) is 341 with a staff of 23. The school's vice-principal is Danny Boyne.
 Mr. Jefferis admits he's enjoyed his years as an educator. He marvels at the opportunities available to young people today.
 "There's pride in knowing you've done a good job," he says. "Nothing gives me greater satisfaction than having students come back years later and expressing thanks."
 Jim appreciates the warm reception he received from staff on opening day. "They made me feel at home."
 Jim and Barbara Jefferis reside in Newmarket. They have two daughters, Jo Anne and Deena. Jo Anne is a teacher on the staff of Unionville Public School.
