

# Official opening of new facility unsure

STOUFFVILLE — Increased enrollment at Stouffville Christian School this September is indicative of its need for more permanent housing accommodations.

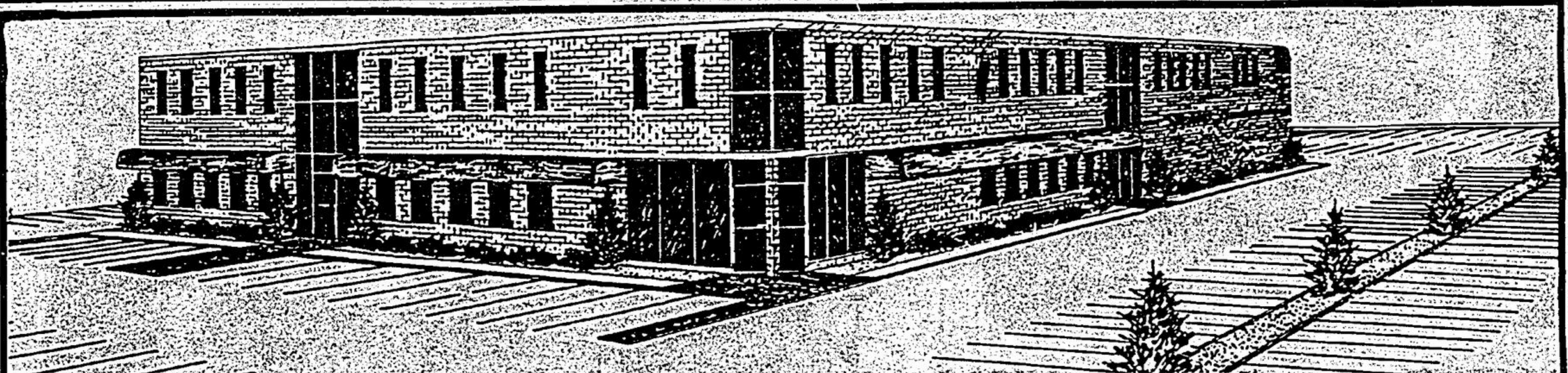
