Applications being accepted

YORK REGION — The York Regional Police Force is accepting applications for the position of Auxiliary Constable on the York Regional Police Auxiliary Organization.

Comprised of citizens residing in York Region who assist their police force by volunteering their services to the community, applicants must be between 21 and 50 years of age and be Canadian citizens or British subjects. They must also be in good health and are required to undergo the same

screening process as regular police officers.

Auxiliary officers will undergo an extensive 12 week training program and before they are eligible to be sworn in, must pass examinations based on their training. They are further required to devote at least eight hours to field duties per month and attend one training session per month. The field duties are usually comprised of foot or vehicle patrols.

The officers assist in special

events in the community such as Santa Claus parades and Spring and Fall Fairs. These men and women are also called upon to assist in searching for missing persons or are used for crowd control at disaster scenes, etc.

This is a volunteer organization and successful applicants will begin their training sessions early in 1988.
