# New storage location sought for Town's 'odds and ends'

STOUFFVILLE — The block building on Burkholder Street, presently used for storage, has been recommended as a possible location to store equipment once housed in the old arena.

With the demolition of the old rink impending, all artifacts stored there after the new Recreation Complex began operation will have to be placed elsewhere.

Engineering Coordinator Paul Whitehouse has been investigating possible locations to house the equipment until a proper storage building is constructed.

In a report to Town Council he recommended the Recycling Depot would be "ideal" for Parks/Works equipment should it ever cease operation.

But for the interim, he recommended the block building be used in conjunction with space available in the Depot and Works garage.

Included within the long inventory list is a large chest-

style freezer, deep fryer, coffee machine, 11 toilets, tennis nets, chain link fences, 30 metal folding chairs and a broken hot chocolate machine.

One suggestion raised in Council was to auction off those items not being used. Another was to notify smaller municipalities of artifacts they might find

useful, like hockey nets or a time-clock.

Whatever the Town decides to do with the present collection, Councillor Jim Sanders suggested Council prepare a policy on how to rid themselves of unwanted municipal items in the future.
