Program planners need help

The York Region Branch of the Canadian Mental Health Association is busy planning its fifth Festive Gifts Program for Psychiatric Patients.

But co-ordinator Lorelei Parchment needs volunteers to help plan and carry out the program.

It's run entirely by volunteers who want to help make the Christmas season a little happier for York Region residents who suffer from psychiatric conditions.

Parchment says last year's program served 100 adults, 53 children and 23 residents across the region. This year, she expects that number to double.

The Canadian Mental Health Association is a non-profit, voluntary organization whose mandate is to remove the stigma of mental illness and to promote mental health among all Canadians.

This mandate is achieved through programs that respond to the mental health needs of the local community through direct service to patients and ex-psychiatric patients, through advocacy, public education and programming.

The program is in need of volunteers who will help with the planning and carrying out of the Festive Gifts Program.


