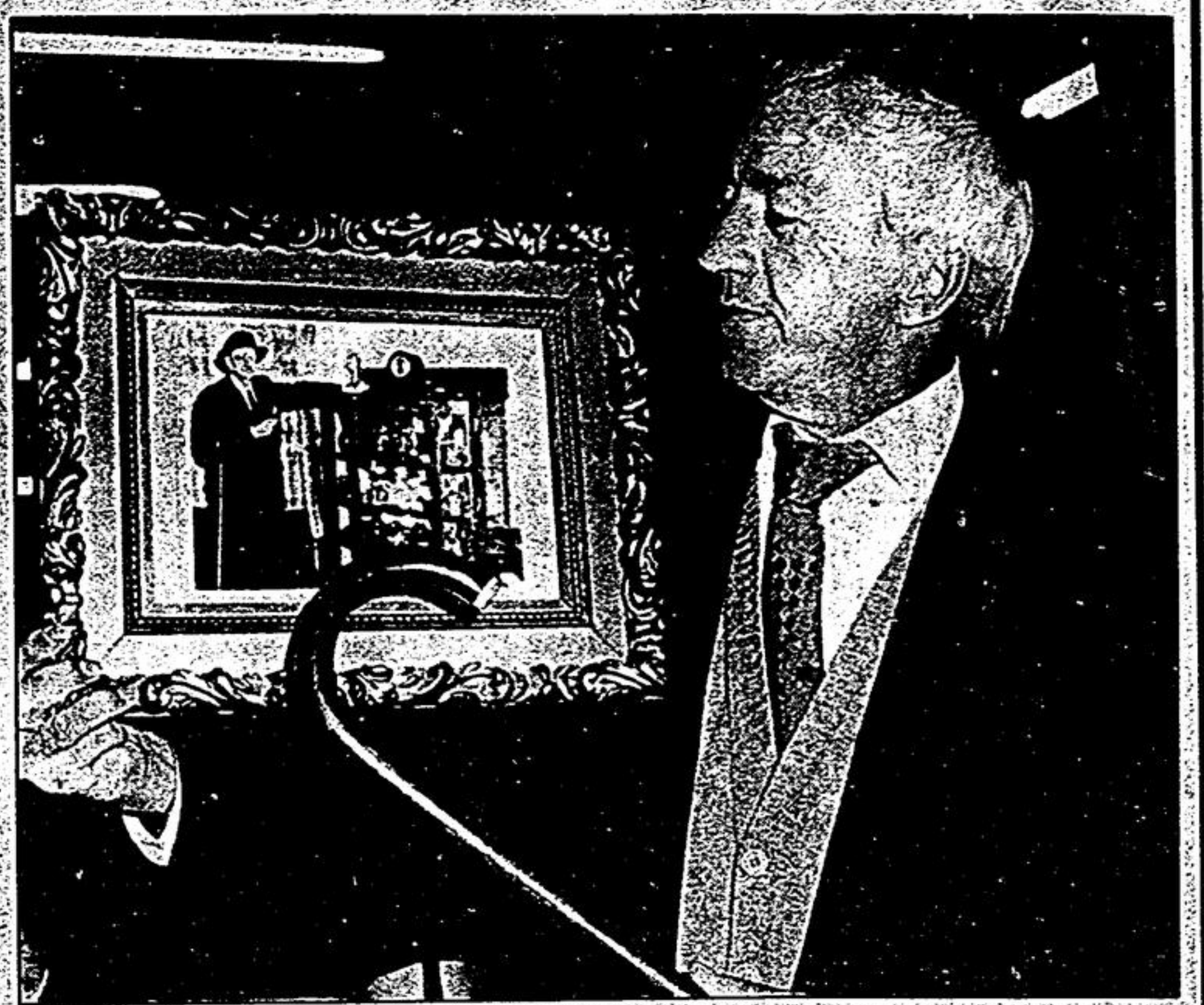

### At Stouffville Sales Barn Auctioneer's auction

STOUFFVILLE — Non-stop, rapid-fire auctioneers' prattle filled the Sales Barn, Thursday, as property belonging to the late Fred Smith went on the block.

A crowd of close to 200 gathered around as Norm and Phil Faulkner, Bill Walker and Jim Couch maintained a pace that would certainly have pleased Mr. Smith, a licensed auctioneer himself for 72 years.

The extensive list of items included numerous antique silver services, cranberry glassware, linens, needlepoint and various framed pictures.

Novelty pieces such as an antique leather-bound ledger and a Christie soda biscuit tin retained the interest of casual buyers while items of greater value brought bids from collectors.

Fred Smith is thought to have been the longest licensed auctioneer in Canada. He began hand-

ling sales as far back as 1908. He had a fast, no-hesitation style. Oft-times, listeners were hard-pressed to keep up.

Mr. Smith was a lifelong resident of the Newmarket-Kettleby area. He became well known because of his auctioneering skills.

A highlight of his career was meeting Wm. Lyon Mackenzie King, later to become Canada's prime minister.

The auctioneer's cane is an important piece of equipment. Mr. Smith had 15 of them in the sale, Thursday. They attracted much interest, one going for as high as \$50.

In the main ring, all five auctioneers went to work, creating an entertaining evening for both bidders and bystanders.

Yes, Fred Smith would have given the proceedings his stamp of approval.
