Wild birds are flying south.



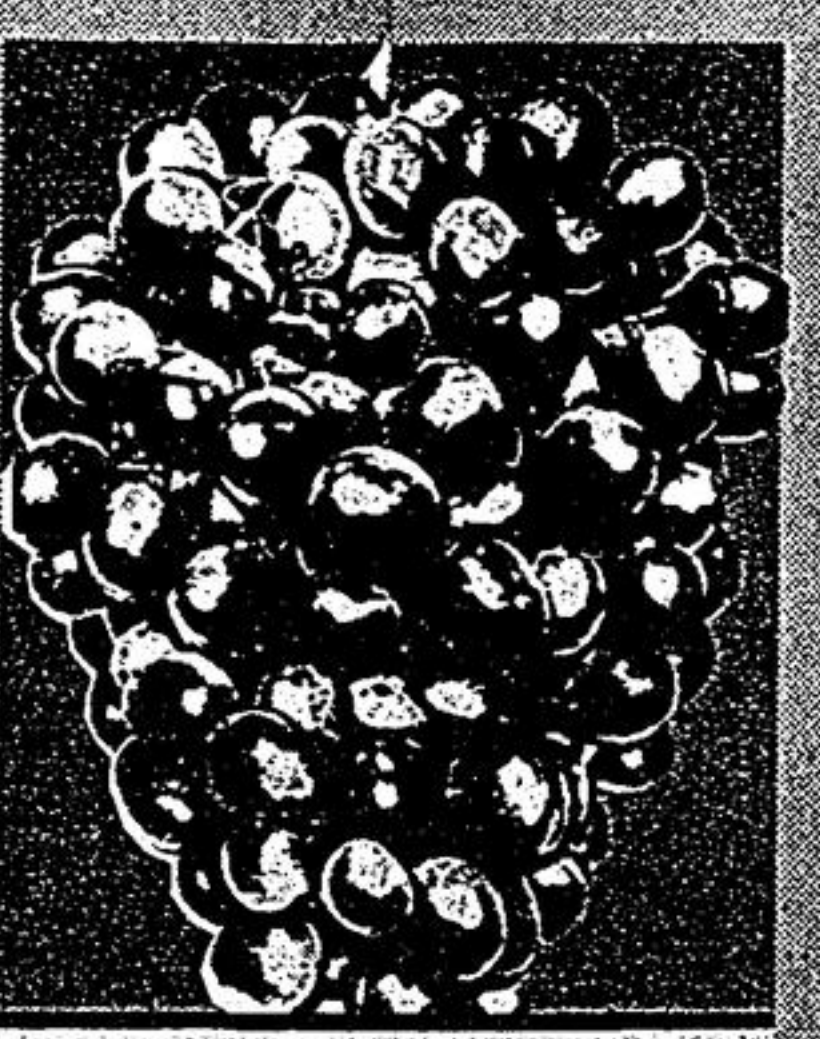

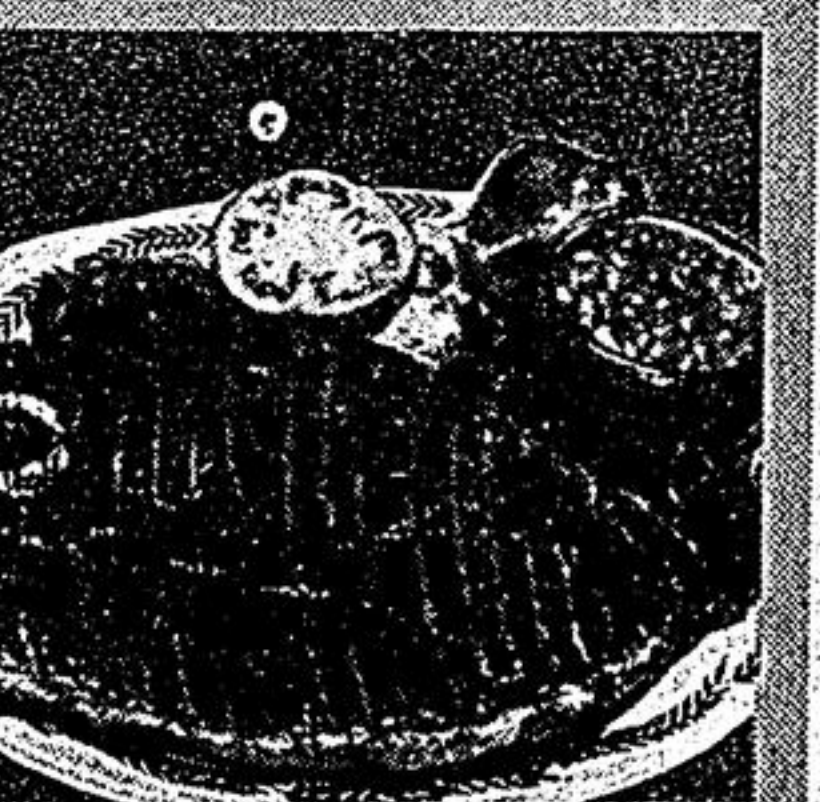
